BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 6-4 | AWAY: 5-2 | STREAK: L2 | LAST 5: 3-2 | LAST 10: 6-4

LONG NIGHT ON RIVERFRONT: A dropped fly ball in extra innings on Saturday allowed two runs to score for the Down East Wood Ducks, as they swept both ends of a doubleheader from the Wilmington Blue Rocks at Frawley Stadium. The Rocks lost the opener, 9-1, and then fell 3-2 in eight innings during the nightcap. It marked the first time Wilmington dropped consecutive games since the first two contests of the season. **Brewer Hicklen** had the ball go off his glove with two on in the top of the eighth inning. As per Minor League Baseball rules, Down East started extra innings with a runner at second base. The Wood Ducks then drew a walk and catcher **MJ Melendez** made an errant pickoff toss that allowed both runners to advance. After **Tyler Zuber** bounced back with a strikeout, Julio Pablo Martínez lifted a ball to Hicklen in left. It was ruled a sacrifice fly, but the misplay allowed both Wood Ducks to score and proved to be the difference in the game.

TWICE THE MISERY FOR THE HOME TEAM: Wilmington has already played three doubleheaders in just the first two-and-a-half weeks of the 2019 campaign. Ironically, all three of the Rocks' early season rainouts have come on Fridays and consequently all of the doubleheaders have been on Saturdays. Wilmington is 3-3 in twin bills this year, with an April 13 sweep of Carolina, a split against Salem on April 6 and two losses to Down East on Saturday.

PLENTY OF CLOSE CALLS: The Blue Crew have seen five of their last six games decided by only a single score. Unfortunately for the home team, Saturday was their first loss during that stretch of tight baseball. Wilmington is now 7-4 in one-run contests this year. The 11 games decided by just one run are the most in the Carolina League over the first two-and-a-half weeks of the 2019 campaign. The Rocks also played their second extra-innings affair of the season and are now 1-1 in contests that are not decided in regulation.

DEFENSIVE MISGIVINGS: The Blue Rocks continue to struggle defensively in 2019. Wilmington committed four more errors in the opener of Saturday's doubleheader. It marked the second time this season the Rocks have committed four or more defensive miscues in a game and the fifth time in only 17 contests they been guilty of at least three. The Rocks added another in the nightcap and are last in the Carolina League with 26 total errors as a team. They have committed at least one defensive miscue in all but four games on the year.

TOUGH YARD TO LEAVE: The Blue Rocks hit eight home runs during their first road trip of the season, but have managed just one at the pitcher-friendly confines of Frawley Stadium. **Kyle Isbel** hit Wilmington's only home dinger of the young year on Opening Day. The Rocks have gone nine consecutive games in the First State without one since.

ON THE HUNT FOR HITS: Wilmington has the second-best record in the Carolina League, but the Rocks have had a hard time getting hits. Saturday's doubleheader saw the Blue Crew manage just six total hits over 15 innings. On the season Wilmington has mustered four hits or fewer nine times in 17 games. Remarkably, the Blue Crew are 5-4 in those contests

SOUTHERN COMFORT: Wilmington is in the midst of 17 straight games against the CL South, going 9-4 to this point in interdivision tests.

Tomorrow's Starting Pitcher for Wilmington

Marcelo Martínez will make his Advanced-A Debut on Wednesday. The 22-year-old left-hander started his season in Low-A Lexington, making two starts and not allowing a run over nine innings of work. Martínez replaces Nolan Watson in the Wilmington rotation after the righty was placed on the Injured List earlier in the week. A native of Reynosa, Mexico, Martínez was signed by the Royals on March 7 of last year. He split his first season of professional baseball between three levels. He made one start at Low-A Lexington and pitched twice out of the bullpen for Rookie-Idaho Falls. Martínez spent most of the year at Rookie-Burlington, where he was named Burlington's Pitcher of The Year.

THE BOOK ON BRADY SINGER: Brady Singer will make his fourth start of the season for the Blue Rocks and the fourth of his professional career. Singer was the Royals' first of three first-round picks (No. 18 overall) in last June's draft. The University of Florida product chose the college route over signing with the Toronto Blue Jays, who originally drafted him in the second round out of high school in 2015. The patience paid off when Singer signed for \$4.25 million with the Royals last summer. Singer won a national championship with the Gators in 2017 and then earned the Dick Howser Award last year despite pitching through a nagging hamstring injury.

LAST TIME OUT: Singer earned the first win of his professional career earlier in the week at Winston-Salem. The righty yielded three runs on three hits, a walk and a hit batter in six frames. He also fanned five, throwing 54 of his 88 pitches for strikes in the outing.

QUITE THE COLLEGE CAREER: Singer accomplished about everything a college pitcher possibly could during his junior season at Florida. He was named SEC Pitcher of the Year after leading the conference in wins and ERA. He won the Dick Howser Trophy--an award given annually to the nation's top college baseball player. He was also one of four finalists for the Golden Spikes Award, joining: Casey Mize (first overall pick), Kody Clemens (79th) and Andrew Vaughn and was named Baseball America College Baseball Player of the Year-- becoming the fourth player drafted by the Royals to earn the honor (Wil Myers--2012, Alex Gordon--2006 and Tom Gordon--1988).

FIRST-ROUND TRIO BUILDING A BOND: Last June, the Kansas City front office spent more than \$8 million on three college pitchers among the first 34 picks of the draft, selecting Singer 18th, Jackson Kowar 33rd and Daniel Lynch at No. 34. Fortunately for the Royals, the trio gets along great. Singer and Kowar lived together for three years at the University of Florida. Lynch and Kowar roomed together last season in Lexington, and all three got an apartment together this season in Wilmington. "We understand that we're all in this thing kind of together," Lynch says. "The Royals have done a great job of expressing that to us. It's not about who's going to be the ace, it's about being teammates, having success as a team and about us moving up together."

HYPER-COMPETITIVE: Singer is a bulldog of a competitor. He lives for it. In fact, teammate Jackson Kowar calls him the most competitive person he's ever met. The best example came on national television last season. Singer was on the mound for the Gators in Game Three of the NCAA Super Regionals against Wake Forest when it started to rain. Singer stared up at the sky and unleashed a torrent of raw emotion directed at Mother Nature for interrupting such a critical moment. A teammate had to come and walk him from the mound back to the dugout. This spring Royals assistant general manager J.J. Picollo told The Athletic how much he and the Royals loved to see that side of Singer on such a big stage. "It's why he had the success he had and why he stood out so much," Picollo said. "It's an intensity that he has under control, too." Picollo also told The Athletic it wasn't just the national stage that Singer wants to take. The Royals removed him from an intrasquad game this spring after he took a comebacker off the leg. It was out of an abundance of caution, but as Picollo put it, he was none too pleased about not being able to finish the inning.

WHAT A CHRISTMAS GIFT: Most everyone loves their parents, but few have put a value on how much their Mom and Dad's love meant better than Singer. This past Christmas Singer posted an emotional video on his twitter account where he provided his parents with an incredibly generous gift. In a letter which his mom read out loud, Singer wrote: "Thank you for everything you've done to help me reach my dreams. There's absolutely no way I could have done all this by myself. Both of you constantly took off of work and spent every dime you made just to put a smile on my face. My smile and appreciation for both of you has never stopped and it never will." After reading how he could never repay them, Singer's mother went into stunned silence as she read the line that was Singer's gift to them: paying off a loan from the bank and their debt. The letter wrapped up with this line from Singer: "Your giving hearts helped to shape my tiny dream into a reality," Singer wrote in the letter's conclusion." Singer said he didn't expect the gesture it did, but he made the gift public because: "I wanted kids to see you should help the people that got you here. I didn't get here by myself. My parents did so much for me. I want to do anything I can to help them."
