#### NEWS AND NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Columbia played in one of the more compelling games of the season on Sunday. The Fireflies erased a two-run deficit but ultimately fell behind again after Augusta scored an eighth-inning run. The GreenJackets downed Columbia, 3-2, and clinched a playoff berth in the process. **Nick Conti** smashed a clutch home run in the fifth inning to knot the score at 2-2. Augusta punched back in the eighth with an Andres Angulo triple. He scored a few moments later on Mikey Edie's single to take the lead for good. **Shervien Newton** and **Guillermo Granadillo** each notched a pair of hits and **Alec Kisen** was brilliant at times on the mound. After allowing a first-inning home run, Kisen didn't allow a hit the rest of the way and pitched into the sixth.

**ONE LEFT:** The Fireflies close out their 2019 season on Labor Day at SRP Park. Columbia is 0-3 in season finales. So what's the motivation today? Well, with a win, the Fireflies will avoid tying their worst half-season record (28-42 - 2017, 2nd half).

**FINISHING STRONG:** Columbia's leadoff hitter, **Nick Conti**, has performed very well at the plate and in the field over the last week. Conti is on a six-game hitting streak and helped turn three double plays in Sunday's game.

**THE ALL-STAR:** There's just one game left for Columbia's lone All-Star in 2019, **Ronny Mauricio**. The top-rated Mets prospect came to the Palmetto State with high expectations and he just about exceeded all of them. Mauricio set the Fireflies single-season hits record (125 and counting) and is going to finish the year with the highest batting average for a Firefly who played in more than 100 games. At just 18 years old, Mauricio showed off above average fielding prowess, quickness and a deft glove at short.

**THESE GUYS MADE THEIR MARK:** Another Mets prospect, **Mark Vientos**, is going to finish with one of the highest RBI totals in franchise history (62 and counting) and maybe, just maybe, can tie the single-season home run mark (13) with one more blast on Monday. Reliever **Allan Winans** will also finish with the second-most saves in club history, too. Winans has gone 11-for-13 in save chances.

**DEVELOP AND ADVANCE:** That really is the ultimate goal for these Fireflies players and a total of 13 earned promotions at points during the 2019 season. Congratulations to these 13 on advancing: **Wagner Lagrange, Jose Medina, Hansel Moreno, Colin Holderman, Tylor Megill, Andrew Mitchell, Dedniel Nunez, Conner O'Neil, Darwin Ramos, Luc Rennie, Thomas Szapucki, Simeon Woods-Richardson, Ezequiel Zabaleta**. Megill and Rennie each earned promotions to double-A Binghamton in 2019.

#### 2020 FIREFLIES SCHEDULE RELEASE

In conjunction with the South Atlantic League, the Columbia Fireflies have [officially released their schedule for the 2020 season](#). Opening day is set for Thursday, April 9 which will mark the fifth season of Fireflies baseball at Segra Park.

Columbia begins the year with seven straight games at home, four against the Augusta GreenJackets (San Francisco Giants) and three against the Kannapolis Intimidators (Chicago White Sox).

The Fireflies play a 140-game schedule in the SAL with 70 home games played at Segra Park - the 2018 South Atlantic League's Best Playing Surface and 2016 *Ballpark Digest* Ballpark of the Year. Check out the highlights of the 2020 home schedule:

#### STAR POWER AT SHORT

Fireflies shortstop and top-rated Mets prospect **Ronny Mauricio** was named a South Atlantic League All-Star. The switch-hitting infielder ripped a double in his lone plate appearance at Appalachian Power Park on June 18.

Mauricio is just 18 years old and initially signed with the Mets in the summer of 2017. The shortstop has had a stellar season and set the new Fireflies single-season hits record on August 6 in Hagerstown. That day, Mauricio notched his 112th hit, topping J.C. Rodriguez's prior mark of 111 from 2016.

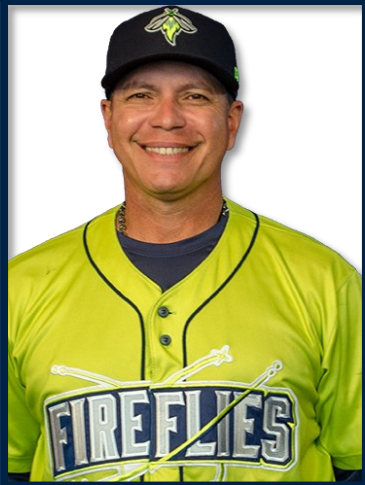

## 2019 FIREFLIES MANAGER & COACHING STAFF

### MANAGER PEDRO LOPEZ



On January 17, 2018, the **New York Mets** named **two-time Eastern League (AA) Manager of the Year Pedro Lopez** the next Fireflies skipper. The 2019 season marks Lopez's second season as manager of the Fireflies, his 12th as a skipper in the Mets minor league system and his 17th overall. Lopez has managed every full-season level of the Mets system and picked up his 900th career managerial win on June 22, 2018 at home against the Lakewood BlueClaws.

The **2013 Eastern League Manager of the Year** has accumulated 929 wins (19th-most among active MiLB managers) over 17 years as a manager and has guided dozens of future big leaguers including Noah Syndergaard, Matt Harvey, Jacob deGrom and Edinson Volquez. In fact, **Lopez has guided his teams to the playoffs in six of his 11 years in the Mets system.**

The 50-year-old led the double-A Binghamton Mets (now Rumble Ponies) to one of the most prolific stretches in the club's history from 2012 to 2016. **The 'B-Mets' won the 2014 Eastern League crown and Lopez was inducted into the Binghamton Baseball Shrine the following year (2015).** The 2013 campaign was stellar as well. The Vega Baja, Puerto Rico,

native guided the B-Mets to a franchise-record 86 victories and a playoff appearance. He is the winningest manager in Binghamton Mets history.

Lopez enjoyed a lengthy playing career before joining the coaching ranks. **The former catcher and infielder was drafted in 1988 by the San Diego Padres** out of Arizona Western College in the 21st round. Lopez played 13 years of Minor League Baseball in the Padres (1988-1994), Milwaukee Brewers (1995-96) and Houston Astros (1997-2000) organizations. He tallied 690 hits and 338 RBIs in 909 professional games. Lopez not only coached in the South Atlantic League (Savannah, 2010 and 2001) previously, but played in the league as well in 1990 as a 21-year-old for the Charleston Rainbows.

Before joining the Mets organization, Lopez spent seven seasons (2001-07) managing and coaching in the Texas Rangers organization.

Lopez and his wife, Gladys, have twins: Leslian Marie and Laney Marie. They live in Puerto Rico during the winter.

### Coaching Staff

**Josh Towers (Pitching Coach)** - Towers took over as Columbia's pitching coach on June 20 after Royce Ring was promoted to the triple-A Syracuse Mets. Towers spent eight seasons pitching in the majors for the Orioles, Blue Jays and Yankees and now rejoins the Mets organization after previously spending the 2013 season as the pitching coach for the rookie-level GCL Mets. The 42-year-old appeared in 139 MLB games (starting 112) and compiled a 45-55 record and 4.95 ERA. He posted career-best numbers in 2005 with the Blue Jays when he won 13 games and notched a 3.71 ERA over 33 starts. Towers also earned a World Series ring after pitching for the Yankees during the regular season in 2009. The Oxnard, California, native was originally a 15<sup>th</sup>-round draft choice of the Orioles in 1996 out of Oxnard College.

**Luis Rivera (Hitting Coach)** - Rivera begins his first season as hitting coach in Columbia and his 10th as a manager or coach in the Mets organization. Rivera most recently was the bench coach for the double-A Binghamton Rumble Ponies in 2018 and the manager of the Kingsport Mets from 2015-17. Prior to that, the Carolina, Puerto Rico, native coached alongside Pedro Lopez in Binghamton in 2014 (hitting coach). He & Lopez won the Eastern League title in 2014. Rivera played professionally in the Mets and Cubs organizations from 2005-2010.

**Gilbert Gomez (Bench Coach)** - Gomez begins his first season as bench coach in Columbia and his second as a coach in the Mets organization. Gomez was playing in the Mets organization (and at one point for current Fireflies manager Pedro Lopez) as recently as 2015 with the double-A Binghamton Mets. The Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, native was a Mets farm-hand from 2009 to 2015, reaching as high as double-A. He played in the South Atlantic League in 2012 for the prior Mets affiliate, the Savannah Sand Gnats.

**Daichi Arima (Athletic Trainer)**, from Kumamoto, Japan, begins his first season with Columbia and fifth in the Mets organization

**Sam Nickelsen (Strength and Conditioning Coach)**, from Tampa, Florida, begins his first season with Columbia and third in the Mets organization

**Nicole Collins (Assistant Athletic Trainer)**, from Illinois, is in her first season on the Fireflies coaching staff.

**Dave Williams (Mental Skills Coach)**, a North Dakota native, is in his first season on the Fireflies coaching staff.
