TODAY'S GAME: Game one of a three-game series to wrap up the first half against the Jupiter Hammerheads at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium...Game one of a seven-game trip against Jupiter and the Daytona Tortugas...Florida is coming off of a 4-3 homestand against Jupiter and the Bradenton Marauders heading into the All-Star break...Second of four series (11 games) between the two clubs in 2018, and first of six contests in Jupiter...The Fire Frogs took a three-game series (2-1) at Osceola County Stadium from June 9-10...Florida finished 7-10 against Jupiter in 2017, including 5-6 on the road...The Atlanta Braves' affiliate holds a 10-11 all-time record at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 23-year-old Jeremy Walker makes his 13th start of 2018 in the opener of the three-game set against the Jupiter Hammerheads on Monday...The 6'5" hurler suffered his sixth loss of the season in a 2-1 defeat to the Hammerheads on June 9...The right-hander went all seven innings in the back end of the doubleheader, allowing two runs on four hits and three strikeouts on 86 pitches (56 strikes)...Monday will be Walker's second career start against the Miami Marlins' High-A affiliate.

FLORIDA SPLITS SERIES WITH 8-2 VICTORY OVER BRADENTON: Kyle Muller became the third Florida Fire Frogs pitcher to toss seven frames this week, as the left-handed starter earned his second win of the season at the Advanced-A level in the 8-2 victory over the Bradenton Marauders at Osceola County Stadium on Thursday night. The win finished the pre-All-Star break schedule with a four-game series split against the Pittsburgh Pirates' affiliate.

The Fire Frogs pushed across a run in the second on an RBI single from Garrison Schwartz, who then capped off a five-run third with a three-run double.

MULLER MOWS 'EM DOWN: Kyle Muller set a career-high with seven innings pitched in the finale against the Marauders. The left-hander allowed an infield, broken-bat single to Jared Oliva to start the night, but struck out next three batters to get out of the opening frame, The 6-foot-7 hurler retired the following six men, before issuing a lead-off walk to Alfredo Reyes in the fourth.

The Dallas native ran into trouble in the fifth. Carrying a 7-0 advantage into the frame, the Fire Frogs' starter allowed a run to cross on three walks and a hit on 33 pitches. The 2016 second-round draft pick managed to work two more innings after the laborious fifth, finishing the night with a career-high, seven innings of work. The southpaw tied a season-high with six punchouts, and limited Bradenton to two hits on seven hits and four free passes. Of the six strikeouts from the starter, five came on changeups.

MAKING THEM EARN IT: Justin Kelly tossed two more scoreless frames in the final game of the four-game series...The southpaw has not allowed a run to cross the plate over his last four appearances, covering six innings...The 25-year-old reliever has not had an earned run since May 11 against the Tampa Tarpons (seven games/13 innings), plummeting his ERA from 4.91 to 2.25.

USE THE SCHWARTZ!: Garrison Schwartz's three-run double in the third inning gave the outfielder a new career-high with four RBI on the night against Bradenton...The four men driven in were more than the 22-year-old had brought across over his previous 21 games...The product of Grand Canyon's previous career-best was three, set on Aug. 23, 2017 against the Pulaski Yankees, which has been Schwartz's only career multi-homerun performance.

 2017: Acquired by Atlanta in January and played the full season with Single-A Rome...His 92 strikeouts led all Atlanta relief farmhands, and his 12.4 SO/9.0 IP was the second-best rate in the system (min. 60.0 IP)...Also ranked in the Top 10 among Atlanta's relief prospects (min. 30.0 IP) in hits per 9.0 innings (6th, 6.5), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6th, 3.68) and ERA (7th, 2.16)...Opponents batted just .198 (48-for-243) against him.
 2016: Made his professional debut with Low-A Everett after being selected by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...Struck out 13.5 batters per 9.0 innings, the second-highest rate in the Mariners system (min. 20.0 IP)...Held left-handed batters to a .111 (3-for-27) average and zero extra-base hits, while righties batted .290 (20-for-69)...Finished his career at Alabama as the school's career leader with 30 saves after pitching three seasons for the Crimson Tide.

 2017: Began the season on the major league disabled list before spending the remainder of the season in the minor leagues with Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett...Went 3-2 with a 6.20 ERA (31 ER/45.0 IP) in 41 combined games out of the bullpen...Walked 46 while striking out 39. Placed on the 10-day disabled list on 3/30 with a right elbow strain and after making a rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida and Triple-A Gwinnett, was optioned to the G-Braves the day he was activated, 5/7. Optioned to the M-Braves on 8/2, where he finished the season...Issued at least one walk in 12 of his 14 games with Mississippi.
 2016: Split the season between Atlanta and Double-A Mississippi, making his major league debut on 6/27 with a scoreless inning of relief vs. CLE. Started the year with the M-Braves before the Braves recalled him on 6/27...Remained with the Braves for the remainder of the season, finishing with six saves and five wins to become the eighth Braves rookie in Atlanta franchise history to have at least five wins and five saves in a season...Mike Stanton did it last in 1991, winning five times and saving seven games. His six saves were fourth most among MLB rookies...From the date of his debut (6/27) through the end of the season, his 41 games pitched tied for the most appearances by a rookie pitcher in the majors...Among all pitchers in that time frame, Cabrera tied for the seventh most appearances in the majors, five off the lead of ARI's Randall Delgado and SD's Brad Hand. Did not allow a home run over his 38.1 innings. Finished with the second-highest average pitch velocity in the majors at 100.6...Only Aroldis Chapman (100.9) threw harder, according to MLB's Statcast...He and Chapman were the only two pitchers to throw a pitch at least 103 mph. Earned his first career win, 7/19 at CIN. Collected his first save, 6/30 vs. MIA. Compiled a 1.25 ERA (3 ER/21.2 IP) over 21 games, 6/23-9/7.
