TODAY'S GAMES: Game two of a three-game series against the Palm Beach Cardinals (StL) from Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium (1-0)...Florida is coming off a two-game split against the Charlotte Stone Crabs at Osceola County Stadium... Third of four series (12 games) against the St. Louis Cardinals' affiliate, with six games at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium...The Atlanta Braves' affiliate dropped two of three on the road against the Cardinals from April 13-15...The Fire Frogs are 5-4 at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium in 2018.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 22-year-old Tucker Davidson makes his 16th start of the season in game two of the three-game series against the Palm Beach Cardinals on Saturday night...The Amarillo, Texas native entered the 2018 season as the 13th- (Baseball America) and 23rd- (MLB.com) ranked prospect in the Atlanta Braves organization...The southpaw did not factor into the decision of a 4-3 loss to the Daytona Tortugas on July 1...The 6-foot-2 hurler allowed two runs on six hits, two walks and a strikeout in five innings of work on 89 pitches (54 strikes)...Saturday will be Davidson's first career start against the Cardinals.

FLORIDA COMES FROM BEHIND TO STEAL GAME ONE: The Florida Fire Frogs rallied on three separate occasions to take out the Palm Beach Cardinals, 6-5, to open up a three-game, weekend series at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium on Friday night. Florida came back from two two-run deficits, and trailed by a run entering the final frame before Brett Cumberland smacked a two-run shot over the wall in right to give the visitors their third consecutive road victory.

Thomas Burrows earned the win out of the bullpen, and Justin Kelly earned his second save of the year with a scoreless ninth.

FALLING JUST SHY: Brett Cumberland paced the offense with three of the team's eight hits, and fell a triple shy of the cycle...The switch-hitter flew out to right field in his first at-bat, before doubling and scoring a run in the fourth...The product of Cal singled home a run in the fifth, struck out in the seventh, and clubbed the game-winning, two-run homer in the ninth...There have been five occurrences in which a Florida batter has come a hit shy of the cycle, and all five batters have been missing the triple...Cristian Pache has fallen short of the milestone three times in 2018, with Jared James coming a three-bagger shy on April 18 against the St. Lucie Mets...Cumberland's long ball was his ninth of the year, but only his second with a runner on base.

EARNING THAT "W": Thomas Burrows earned his first win in a month with a run allowed on two hits, a walk and five punchouts in the series opener...Since picking up his last victory since June 6, the product of Alabama had allowed four runs on nine hits, eight free passes, and seven strikeouts across 7.1 innings in six appearances.

SAVING THE DAY: Justin Kelly worked around a lead-off walk to Andy Young in the ninth inning to pick up his first save since May 9...The lefty had appeared in 12 games before locking down Friday's victory, yielding eight runs - six earned - and earning two wins...The 25-year-old has pitched in the final inning nine times this season in 21 relief appearances.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: The first three road games of the second half have all come at Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium, and the Fire Frogs are off to a perfect, 3-0 start in Jupiter...Florida took both games against the Hammerheads from July 2-3...During the team's second season, the Atlanta Braves' High-A affiliate is 5-4 at "The Dean," and has a better win percentage on the road (.462) than at Osceola County Stadium (.390), despite having a better average at home (.238 to .220) and ERA (3.14 to 4.69).

2017: Played his first full professional season with Single-A Rome, and went 5-4 with a 2.60 ERA (30 ER/103.2 IP) and 101 strikeouts over 31 games (12 starts)...His 2.60 ERA tied for the second-best mark among Atlanta's starting pitcher prospects (min. 75.0 IP)...Logged a 1-2 record and a 2.38 ERA in 19 relief appearances, and a 4-2 mark with a 2.76 ERA in 12 starts...Allowed left-handed batters to hit just .180 (23-for-128) against him...Surrendered fewer than two earned runs in 29 of his 31 appearances.

College: Was slated to play for North Carolina State before Atlanta drafted him in the 19th round (559th overall)...Went 6-2 with a 2.27 ERA in 71.1 innings, with 75 strikeouts and 20 walks...Allowed just three home runs his sophomore season...Had a 67.8 strike percentage...Selected to the All-Western Junior College Athletic Association first team.
