### TRIBE TIPS

**LAST NIGHT:** The Indians fell behind 9-0 after two innings of play and couldn't recover in a 9-1 loss to the Clippers on Friday night. Eduardo Vera was on the wrong end of the outcome as Columbus tagged him with nine earned runs on nine hits in 1.2 innings of work. Vera's counterpart Michael Peoples stymied the Tribe bats over 6.0 innings pitched to just one run on five hits and two walks with seven punchouts. Indy's bullpen quartet of Yefry Ramirez, Geoff Hartlieb, Tyler Lyons and JB Shuck combined for 6.1 shutout innings, but a Cole Tucker RBI groundout that scored Jake Elmore in the fifth was all the Tribe offense could muster.

**SHORT MEMORY:** Last night's 9-1 loss matched the largest margin of defeat for Indy this season, with the most recent eight-run loss coming in Game 2 of a doubleheader on June 16 vs. Pawtucket, an 8-0 setback. Indy has now been beaten by eight runs five times and are just 17-24 in games decided by three or more runs. The eight-run loss was the largest in Indy's head-to-head series with Columbus since an 8-0 loss on April 28, 2018 at Huntington Park.

**15 HITS:** The Tribe pitching staff surrendered 15 hits in the Friday night defeat, marking the fourth time they've given up 15 or more hits in a game this year. Indy is 0-4 in those contests. The first came on May 25 at Columbus in a 15-9 loss. The second and third occurrences happened in consecutive games vs. Buffalo on June 12-13, when Indy yielded 16 and 15 knocks in back-to-back lopsided losses (14-6, 11-3).

**YOU GOTTA SCORE:** The Indians tallied just one run last night and fell to 2-22 when scoring two runs or less this season. During their 11-22 stretch dating back to June 7, the Indians have scored a league-low 110 runs (3.33 RPG) on 239 hits (7.24 HPG). Since June 7, the Indians are at the bottom of the league in homers with 18, 12 behind Norfolk who is 13th with 30. Columbus, meanwhile, has belted a league-high 57 home runs since that date.

**MARVEL-OUS:** RHP James Marvel gets the nod tonight for Indy for his second career Triple-A start. Marvel, selected by the Pirates in the 36th round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Duke University, made a strong first impression for Indy with a complete-game shutout in Game 2 of the July 5 twin bill against Toledo (7.0ip, 3h, 0r, 0bb, 6k). His CGSHO was the first by a Tribe pitcher since Adam Wilk on July 6, 2014 vs. Lehigh Valley (9.0ip, 5h, 0r, 1bb, 4k). It was the first CGSHO thrown by a Tribe starter in a doubleheader since Ian Snell on July 5, 2009 vs. Louisville (7.0ip, 5h, 0r, 1bb, 6k).

**TWO HITS FOR HAYES, REYES:** Ke'Bryan Hayes and Pablo Reyes each went 2-for-4 with a pair of singles in last night's setback. The multi-hit performance was the 15th of the season for Hayes with Indy, but the Tribe are just 8-7 when he has two or more knocks. It also marked Reyes' ninth multi-hit showing for the Tribe this year, but the Indians fell to 4-5 when he has two-plus hits.

**SECOND HALF MITCH:** RHP Mitch Keller outdueled Zach Plesac in last night's contest and piled up eight strikeouts, the fifth time he's fanned at least eight batters in a start this season. Over the course of his career, Keller has been a second-half stalwart. In 70 career games (69 starts) before the All-Star break, Keller owns a 23-16 record and 3.43 ERA. In 35 career second-half starts, he is now 13-5 with a 2.76 ERA. Keller ranks among IL leaders in wins (T-2nd, 7), ERA (1st, 3.07), WHIP (3rd, 1.28), average against (3rd, .243), innings pitched (10th, 82.0) and strikeouts (3rd, 96).

**IN A PINCH:** JB Shuck's pinch-hit single in the seventh inning Thursday night was his second of the season and first since his first career at-bat with the Indians in the ninth inning on May 14 vs. Scranton/WB. He is now 2-for-4 with two RBI as a pinch hitter this year, making him one of four Tribe players with multiple pinch-hit knocks in 2019 (also: Trayvon Robinson, 4-for-9; Nick Franklin, 2-for-4; Kevin Kramer, 2-for-6). As a team, the Indians are batting .241 (13-for-54) with one homer, one double and seven RBI. Indy's 54 pinch-hit at-bats are most in the IL.

**BRENTZ WAGON:** Jake Brentz has converted all seven of his save chances with the Indians this season and is tied with teammate Montana DuRapau for the team lead in that category. Brentz has allowed just one earned run over his last 5.1 innings of work, despite having 13 men reach base during that stretch (7 hits, 5 walks, 1 hit batter). Over his last eight appearances since June 13, Brentz has a 12.86 ERA (10er/7.0ip) and 4.14 WHIP (17 hits, 12 walks).

**DEFENSIVELY SOUND:** Indianapolis leads the IL with a .983 team fielding percentage and have the fourth-best fielding percentage in Minor League Baseball, trailing only Round Rock (.986), Iowa (.985) and Double-A Altoona (.984). Indy hasn't led the IL in fielding percentage since 2006 (.982). The Tribe have committed a league-low 53 errors in 3,197 total defensive chances. Indy's catching corps (Christian Kelley, Steven Baron, Jacob Stallings) have also combined for a league-low four passed balls.

**Tonight's Starter:** Right-hander James Marvel takes the mound for his second Triple-A start. The 25-year-old began the season with Double-A Altoona and went 9-5 with a 3.16 ERA (35er/99.2ip).

**Pitcher of the Week:** Marvel earned his first career weekly honor on April 21 when he was named the Eastern League Pitcher of the Week after throwing the first shutout and fourth complete game of his career on April 20 at Richmond. He had just three base runners in the game on one hit, one walk and one error.

**Last Outing:** Marvel pitched his second complete game shutout of the season on July 5 in Game 2 of the doubleheader against Toledo. He allowed just three hits in seven innings and struck out six.

**Six Straight:** Marvel has won his last six starts between Double-A Altoona and Indy and has taken each into at least the seventh inning. He holds a 1.49 ERA (7er/42.1ip) with 26 strikeouts during the stretch.

**Against the Clippers:** Marvel has never faced Columbus.

**Miscellaneous:** Selected by PIT in the 36th round (1,087th overall) of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Duke University. ... Also selected by MIN in the 37th round (1,120th overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign. ... Was one of 10 finalists for the ESPN High School Mr. Baseball Player of the Year Award in 2012. ... Missed the 2015 season while recovering from Tommy John surgery.
