TODAY'S GAME: Game two of a four-game road trip to Fort Myers (MIN) for the Florida Fire Frogs. These teams will play a total of 11 games against one another and won't meet again for another series until August 3-5. Florida is 3-6 all time against the Miracle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 20-year-old Bryse Wilson makes his 2018 season debut after his start was rained out on Saturday... Named by the organization as Rome's Pitcher of the Year after going 10-7 with a 2.50 ERA (38 ER/137.0 IP), one shutout and 139 strikeouts over 26 starts... Paced all Atlanta starting pitcher farmhands in starter's ERA (min. 75.0 IP), and ranked in the Top 10 in wins (2nd, 10), strikeouts (5th, 139) and innings (6th, 137.0), while ranking fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.76) and tied for ninth in hits per 9.0 innings (6.9) among prospects with at least 30.0 innings... Earned South Atlantic League Mid-Season and Post-Season All-Star honors. Wilson is the 12th ranked prospect in the Braves organization according to Baseball America.

FLORIDA FALLS IN BACK-AND-FORTH WITH FORT MYERS: Brett Cumberland continued to stay hot at the dish, and Ian Anderson impressed in his first start of the season, but the Florida Fire Frogs fell just short in a back-and-forth, 6-4 contest at Hammond Stadium against the Fort Myers Miracle to open up a four-game series on Monday night. The Fire Frogs dropped their fourth consecutive game after defeating the Daytona Tortugas, 4-3, in the season opener.

Florida grabbed the early lead in the first on a long, solo home run to right off the bat of Cumberland, who homered for the third time in as many games for the visitors. After Fort Myers struck four three runs in the fourth against the combination of Anderson and Connor Johnstone, Braxton Davidson lifted off for a two-run shot in the sixth to give the Fire Frogs their second lead of the night at 4-3.

That lead did not last long, as the Miracle plated two more against Johnstone in the home half of the frame, and tallied an insurance run in the eighth to come away with the final tally.

IMPRESSIVE 2018 DEBUT: Ian Anderson made his 2018 debut allowing three runs in 3.2 innings. The young righty struck out seven, a season high for any Fire Frogs pitcher. Anderson is the fifth ranked prospect in the Braves organization according to Baseball America.

POWER BATS COME ALIVE: Brett Cumberland continued to impress at the plate homering for the third time in as many games. His three home runs are the most so far in the Florida State League. Cumberland leads the Fire Frogs in average (.375), hits (6), home runs (3), RBIs (4) and runs (6). Braxton Davidson joined in on the power trip hitting a two-run homer in the sixth going 1-for-4 overall.

COMING UP SHORT: Monday night's contest against the Miracle was the fourth time in just five games that a Fire Frogs game had been decided by two runs or less. Florida took the season opener against the Tortugas by a final of 3-2, before falling 4-3 and 2-1 to close out the opening series at home. The Atlanta Braves High-A affiliate finished their inaugural campaign 22-44 in similar games.

HIGHLY RANKED PROSPECTS: Entering the 2018 season, the Atlanta Braves have the second rated farm system in Minor League Baseball, according to MLB.com... Ian Anderson is ranked the top prospect on the Fire Frogs and 49th in Minor League Baseball by MLB.com. Cristian Pache, Joey Wentz and Bryse Wilson are also Fire Frogs players ranked in the top 15 in the Braves organization, according to MLB.com.

YOUNG STARTING PITCHING: The average age of the five projected starting pitchers is 20.6-years-old. Every starting pitcher is 22-years-old or younger with Ian Anderson (19) being the youngest.

SALAZAR TAKES OVER: Luis Salazar is in his first season as the Fire Frogs skipper and his eighth season overall as a manager in the Braves organization... Salazar spent his first five seasons (2011 to 2015) with the organization as the High-A skipper before managing the Double-A Mississippi Braves for the last two seasons (2016 and 2017)... Salazar, who has 20-plus years of minor-league coaching and managerial experience, owns an overall managerial record of 769-836 (.479) over 14 seasons.

KNOWLEDGE FROM CRAFTY LEFTY: The 2018 season is Mike Maroth's third with the Braves organization and his first in a coaching role... Maroth joined the club in September of 2015 and spent his first two years working as the minor league pitching rehabilitation coordinator... Prior to joining Atlanta, Maroth spent four seasons as a pitching coach in the Detroit Tigers farm system, including working his final year (2015) with Triple-A Toledo... Maroth's Major League playing career spanned six seasons from 2002 to 2007, and included a pair of organizations, Detroit (2002-07) and the St. Louis Cardinals (2007)... He made 161 appearances at the Major League level during his career, including 150 starts... Maroth compiled a 50-67 career record and a 5.05 ERA.

FRESH FACE WITH THE BATS: Rene Tosoni is in his first season as a full-time coach in 2018... Tosoni, who made the transition from player to coach after retiring from his professional playing career in 2016, spent the 2017 season working as an assistant coach with Atlanta's Double-A affiliate Mississippi... The former outfielder played parts of seven seasons with the Minnesota Twins and Milwaukee Brewers organizations from 2007 to 2013, including making his major league debut during the 2011 season with Minnesota... He also spent parts of three seasons, from 2014 to 2016, playing in the Independent League.

2017: Named by the organization as Rome's Pitcher of the Year after going 10-7 with a 2.50 ERA (38 ER/137.0 IP), one shutout and 139 strikeouts over 26 starts...Paced all Atlanta starting pitcher farmhands in starter's ERA (min. 75.0 IP), and ranked in the Top 10 in wins (2nd, 10), strikeouts (5th, 139) and innings (6th, 137.0), while ranking fifth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.76) and tied for ninth in hits per 9.0 innings (6.9) among prospects with at least 30.0 innings...Earned South Atlantic League Mid-Season and Post-Season All-Star honors...Was named SAL Pitcher of the Week for 7/3-9 after tossing a five-hit, 9.0-inning shutout on 7/8 vs. West Virginia, fanning seven without a walk... Allowed opponents to bat .211 (105-for-497) on the season, including just a .176 (19-for-108) mark with runners in scoring position...Entered the season tabbed by Baseball America as Atlanta's No. 25 prospect.

2016: Made nine appearances (six starts) after being selected in the fourth round of the First-Year Player Draft and went 1-1 with a 0.67 ERA (2 ER/26.2 IP) for the GCL Braves...Allowed just 16 hits over 26.2 innings and held opponents to a .172 (16-for-93) average, including a .138 (8-for-58) mark by right-handed batters...Did not allow an earned run over 18.0 innings in his six starts, while pitching to a 2.08 ERA (2 ER/8.2 IP) over three relief appearances.

2017: Acquired by Atlanta in January and played the full season with Single-A Rome...His 92 strikeouts led all Atlanta relief farmhands, and his 12.4 SO/9.0 IP was the second-best rate in the system (min. 60.0 IP)...Also ranked in the Top 10 among Atlanta's relief prospects (min. 30.0 IP) in hits per 9.0 innings (6th, 6.5), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6th, 3.68) and ERA (7th, 2.16)...Opponents batted just .198 (48-for-243) against him.
2016: Made his professional debut with Low-A Everett after being selected by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...Struck out 13.5 batters per 9.0 innings, the second-highest rate in the Mariners system (min. 20.0 IP)...Held left-handed batters to a .111 (3-for-27) average and zero extra-base hits, while righties batted .290 (20-for-69)...Finished his career at Alabama as the school's career leader with 30 saves after pitching three seasons for the Crimson Tide.

2017: Began the season on the major league disabled list before spending the remainder of the season in the minor leagues with Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett...Went 3-2 with a 6.20 ERA (31 ER/45.0 IP) in 41 combined games out of the bullpen...Walked 46 while striking out 39. Placed on the 10-day disabled list on 3/30 with a right elbow strain and after making a rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida and Triple-A Gwinnett, was optioned to the G-Braves the day he was activated, 5/7. Optioned to the M-Braves on 8/2, where he finished the season...Issued at least one walk in 12 of his 14 games with Mississippi.
2016: Split the season between Atlanta and Double-A Mississippi, making his major league debut on 6/27 with a scoreless inning of relief vs. CLE. Started the year with the M-Braves before the Braves recalled him on 6/27...Remained with the Braves for the remainder of the season, finishing with six saves and five wins to become the eighth Braves rookie in Atlanta franchise history to have at least five wins and five saves in a season...Mike Stanton did it last in 1991, winning five times and saving seven games. His six saves were fourth most among MLB rookies...From the date of his debut (6/27) through the end of the season, his 41 games pitched tied for the most appearances by a rookie pitcher in the majors...Among all pitchers in that time frame, Cabrera tied for the seventh most appearances in the majors, five off the lead of ARI's Randall Delgado and SD's Brad Hand. Did not allow a home run over his 38.1 innings. Finished with the second-highest average pitch velocity in the majors at 100.6...Only Aroldis Chapman (100.9) threw harder, according to MLB's Statcast...He and Chapman were the only two pitchers to throw a pitch at least 103 mph. Earned his first career win, 7/19 at CIN. Collected his first save, 6/30 vs. MIA. Compiled a 1.25 ERA (3 ER/21.2 IP) over 21 games, 6/23-9/7.

2016: Played his first season of affiliated baseball and split the year between three levels of the Atlanta system, combining to post a 2.93 ERA (10 ER/30.2 IP) between Rome (A), Danville (R) and Carolina (A+)...Issued just four walks while fanning 29 batters, and his 7.25 strikeout-to-walk ratio paced all Atlanta farmhands.

2016: Played his first full season with High-A Carolina and went 4-6 with a 3.08 ERA (21 ER/61.1 IP) and seven saves over 41 appearances...Seven saves were third most on the Mudcats staff and tied for sixth most in the system, while his 41 games were tied for eighth...Tallied a 4-4 record with a 1.74 ERA (10 ER/51.2 IP) and five saves over his first 33 outings on the season, before allowing 11 earned runs over 9.2 innings (10.24 ERA) in his final eight games...Limited opponents to a .248 average, including identical .248 marks by both right-handed (30-for-121) and left-handed (27-for-109) batters...Registered a save in three straight appearances from 7/4-9, tossing 3.0 perfect frames with a pair of strikeouts.
