BLUE ROCKS BREAKDOWN

HOME: 13-13 | AWAY: 8-17 | STREAK: L1 | LAST 5: 3-2 | LAST 10: 4-6

BLUE ROCKS DROP PITCHING DUEL: The series opener between the Wilmington Blue Rocks and the Frederick Keys was a pitching duel in which the Blue Rocks fell just short by the score of 2-1 Tuesday night at Frawley Stadium. **Gerson Garabito** suffered the tough-luck loss despite matching a career-high with seven innings of work while Frederick's starter **Alex Wells** tossed six-plus innings of one-run ball. Catcher **Chase Vallot** homered in his first game back with the Blue Rocks.

7-8-9 DOING JUST FINE: During the first five games of the homestand, the lower third of the Rocks' lineup has either ignited or produced most of the offense.

-Overall, the combination of the last three hitters in the Rocks' lineup have hit a combined .404 (19-for-47) with eight runs scored, four doubles, have driven in seven runs, and have drawn five walks.
 -In the series opener against Salem on Friday, the trio of **Chris DeVito**, **Xavier Fernandez** and **Oliver Nunez** went 4-for-8 with four runs scored, smacked three doubles and drove in two of the four runs in Wilmington's 4-3 win.

LONG BALL FUN: With **Chase Vallot's** solo homer in the second inning in Tuesday's loss, the Rocks have clubbed a home run in 25 of 51 games this season.

-It was Vallot's first game back with the Blue Rocks since May 16.
 -The home run was the first long ball hit at Frawley Stadium for Vallot. His first five were all hit on the road.
 -The Blue Rocks have seven players with multiple home runs this season.
 -Vallot leads the way with six, **Kort Peterson** is right behind him with five, **Emmanuel Rivera** follows with three, **Khalil Lee**, **Xavier Fernandez**, **Brandon Downes** and **Gabriel Cancel** each have hit two with Wilmington.
 -From April 9-14, the Rocks hit a home run in six consecutive games.
 -Wilmington went 2-4 during that span and are 13-12 overall when they hit a home run this season.
 -The Rocks are tied for the third-fewest HR total in the Carolina League with 28.
 -Last season, the Rocks hit 78 total home runs.

STREAKING ON BASE: First baseman **Chris DeVito** and catcher **Meibrys Voloria** are currently riding season-high on-base streaks.

-DeVito extended his season-high, on-base streak to 10 games with a single in Tuesday's loss.
 -Voloria picked up three hits and moved his on-base streak to a season-high seven games in Monday's win over the Salem Red Sox.
 -**Kort Peterson** had his season-high 11-game on-base streak come to an end Tuesday night.
 -He fell two games shy of tying **Khalil Lee's** 13-game on-base streak (5/10-5/23) for longest by a Blue Rocks' hitter this season.
 -The longest on-base streak in franchise history is 33 games which was set by **Eric Hosmer** in 2010.

PETERSON HOLDING KORTE: **Kort Peterson** remains one of the hottest hitters in the Blue Rocks' lineup.

-The outfielder strung together a pair of seven-game hitting streaks over a 17-game span from May 6-24.
 -Both hitting streaks match a career-high for the second-year Blue Rock.
 -He has picked up a hit in 10 of his last 12 games.
 -In the month of May, he slashing .326/.413/.495 in 27 games.
 -**Ranking:** Ninth in the CL in batting average (.296) and sixth in Royals' organization.
 -He is tied for first on the team with 11 multi-hit games this season.
 -Peterson is first on the team in total bases (75), hits (47) and doubles (11), second in home runs (5), and third in RBI (20).
 -He has provided versatility in the Rocks' lineup hitting in the leadoff spot, third, fourth, fifth, eighth and ninth in the lineup this season.

BURT PROVIDING THE HURT: Second-year Blue Rock **D.J. Burt** is not suffering from a sophomore slump in the Carolina League.

-Burt has picked up a hit in seven of his last eight games and hitting .353 over that span.
 -The recent surge at the plate has boosted his overall batting average to .303 which is third in the Carolina League and in the Royals' farm system.
 -He is also third in the CL in on-base percentage (.400).
 -Burt has served as the Rocks' utility man this season, making 11 starts at second base, eight at shortstop, seven in left field and two starts at third base, with his first-career start at the hot corner coming on Saturday.
 -This the first season in his professional career that he has played in the outfield.

LEE THE ON-BASE MACHINE: After going through a 2-for-26 skid in the final eight games of April, **Khalil Lee** is showing great patience at the plate this month.

-The 19-year-old is hitting .283 (26-for-92) and has an OBP of .405
 -Has walked a team-high 16 times.
 -He has drawn at least one walk in 11 of the 26 games this month.
 -Has eight multi-hit games this month.
 -Overall, Lee paces the Carolina League in walks (35), tied for eighth in all of MiLB and is second in the CL in on-base percentage (.409).

THEY SAID IT, CATCHER CHASE VALLOT: On first game back with the team "(Tuesday) night was fun. Being back behind the plate means a lot to me. If I have a bad at-bat, it kind of takes my mind off it and I absolutely love being back there... (On difficulty of being a designated hitter to start the season) "It's not easy. I don't see how guys do it in the big leagues, but it's just not easy going up to the plate every 45 minutes, every hour and if you have a bad at-bat, you just come back to the dugout and naturally you're going to think about it. It just eats at you and you have to be mentally tough to go through that, especially at the lower levels. It was hard to get into that routine. (Looking at return as a fresh start) "I was thinking about that before the game. I felt like it was my first game of the season. I'm going to try and have that mentality in every at-bat and in every game from here on out."

WIL: RHP **Arnaldo Hernandez** (5-2, 3.64 ERA)
 vs.
 FRE: LHP **Zac Lowther** (0-0, -- ERA)

-Right-hander **Arnaldo Hernandez** makes his 10th start of the season tonight and second against the Keys.

-The 22-year-old Venezuelan, was signed by Kansas City on September 18, 2012.
 -Last time out on May 25 against Salem and earned his team-leading fifth win of the season.

-He worked a season-high 6.1 innings, allowed two runs (both earned), three hits, walked three and struck out a season-high eight batters.

-Has been very strong on the mound at Frawley Stadium this season.
 -The righty is 3-0 with a 2.61 ERA in four starts at home (2-2, 4.44 ERA in five starts on the road)

-Earned the win at Frederick on May 20 and worked six scoreless innings, allowed four hits, two walks and struck out two.

-Became first Blue Rocks' pitcher since Matt Tenuta (July 27 - Aug. 20, 2016) to earn four straight wins when he won four straight starts from April 20-May 7.

-During four-game win streak, Hernandez posted a solid 2.45 ERA in 22 innings of work and held opponents to a .241 batting average.

-He has lasted at least five innings in all but two starts this season.
 -Has allowed two earned runs or less in six of his nine starts.

-Last season, he spent the majority of the campaign in Low-A Lexington and finished the season in Triple-A Omaha.

-With the Legends he went 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA in 15 appearances including five starts..

-With Triple-A Omaha he earned a win in two starts and tossed 10.1 innings and allowed just two earned runs. He struck out six and walked four.

-In 2015, he earned the Surprise Royals' Pitcher of the Year Award and led the league with a career-high seven wins.

-Features a fastball, (89-91 mph) curveball, changeup and sinker.

-Lefty **Zac Lowther** makes his Carolina League debut tonight.

-Drafted by Baltimore in the second round (competitive balance round) of the 2017 Draft out of Xavier University.

-He is the highest-drafted player in the program's history.
 -Started the season with the Delmarva Shorebirds (Low-A/South Atlantic League)

-He ranked as one of the best pitchers in the circuit despite a small sample size.
 -The 22-year-old posted a 3-1 record with a sterling 1.16 ERA.

-He allowed just four earned runs in 31 innings of work, allowed 12 hits, walked nine and struck out 51.

-During that span, opposing hitters were hitting just .115 against him.
 -In half of his starts, he racked up 10 or more batters.

-Made his professional debut with the Aberdeen Ironbirds (NY-Penn League)
 -Went 2-2 with a 1.66 ERA in 12G/11GS and struck out an impressive 75 batters in 54.1 innings of work.

-Features a fastball, curveball and changeup.

JOINING THE ROYALS: One of two natives of Venezuela on the roster, **Arnaldo Hernandez** was signed by the Kansas City Royals on September 18, 2012. Since joining the organization, he has put together solid numbers at every level he has played at bouncing between the starting rotation and bullpen. He has good command of his pitches and has a career K/BB ratio of 262/61. He joins fellow right-hander **Jace Vines** as sinker ball pitchers in the starting rotation.

2018: In his last start on May 25 against Salem, he earned his team-leading fifth win of the season.

-He tossed 6.1 innings, allowed two earned runs (both earned) on three hits, walked three and struck out a season-high eight batters.

-Has been very strong on the mound at Frawley Stadium (3-0, 2.61 ERA in four starts) / (2-2, 4.44 ERA in five starts on the road)

-Hernandez became the first Wilmington pitcher since 2016 to earn four straight wins with victories from April 20-May 7 against. (Matt Tenuta July 27 - Aug. 20)

-During the four-game win streak, he posted a solid 2.45 ERA in 22 innings of work and held opponents to a .241 batting average.

-Made Advanced-A debut in a relief appearance for Wilmington on Opening Day at Potomac and allowed one hit, a walk and struck out a batter while recording two-thirds of an inning pitched.

-In his nine starts, Hernandez has allowed two earned runs or less in six of them.

-Has worked at least five innings in all but two starts this season (4/14 vs. LYN, 3.1 IP & 5/20 @ SAL)

2017: Spent the majority of the season with Low-A Lexington and finished the year in Triple-A Omaha.

-With Lexington, he went 2-1 with a 3.63 ERA in 15 appearances including five starts.

-He worked 57 innings and allowed 63 hits, 29 runs, 23 earned runs and had an impressive strikeout to walk ratio of 58 to 8.

-To start the year, the righty struggled and had a 6.14 ERA (10 ER in 14.2 IP) through his first four appearances, two of which were starts.

-He turned it around in his final 13 outings (five starts) and yielded a 2.56 ERA (15 ER in 52.2IP).

-On July 31 against the West Virginia Power, he tossed his first-career complete game (7.0 IP).

-He finished the season in Triple-A Omaha and made two starts, going 1-0 with a 1.74 ERA in 10.1 innings pitched.

-Allowed two earned runs on nine hits, walked four and struck out six.

-His K/BB ratio of 5.33 (64K/12BB) ranked second-best among Royals farmhands (min. 60 IP), trailing former Blue Rock Jakob Junis (5.73, 86K/15BB)

2016: Spent the entire season with the Idaho Falls Chukars (Rookie/Pioneer League) and struggled a bit in the only season of his career that pitched solely as a starting pitcher.

-He posted a 5-2 record with a career-high 5.86 ERA in 14 starts.

-In 70.2 innings pitched, he allowed 99 hits, 54R/46ER, struck out 63 batters and walked 18.

-He ranked among the league leaders in SO/9 (8.02, third), starts (tied for third), BB/9 (2.29, fourth), innings pitched (fourth), and strikeouts (fourth).

-In December of 2016, Hernandez received a 50-game suspension after testing positive for Methamphetamine, a stimulant in violation of the Minor League Drug Prevention and Treatment Program.

2015: Hernandez spent the season at three different levels including in the Dominican Summer League, the Arizona League and in Idaho Falls.

-He went a composite 8-4 with a respectable 2.63 ERA in 17 games with 13 of them being starts.

-In 82 innings of work, he allowed 78 hits, 32R/24ER and had another remarkable K/BB ratio of 79/8.

-In the Arizona League, he posted a career-high seven wins to go with a 2.82 ERA in 14 outings (10 starts) and averaged a strikeout per inning in 67 frames.

-He held opponents to a .235 batting average.

-He earned the Royals' Surprise Pitcher of the Year Award.

-He ranked first in the AZL with his seven wins and was third in ERA among Royals' farmhands.

-Earned AZL postseason All-Star status.

2014: Made his professional debut with the Dominican Summer League Royals and made seven total appearances including three starts. He posted a 1-1 record with a 2.55 ERA and also earned a save in two chances.

-He worked in just 17.2 innings but struck out 19 batters during that span.
