

PETER B. FREUND

OWNER

Peter B. Freund is a minority owner of the New York Yankees and Principal Owner of Trinity Sports Holdings, which was named the 2017 Ballpark Digest Organization of the Year.

Trinity Sports Holdings' portfolio of affiliated minor league baseball teams includes

the Memphis Redbirds, the Charleston RiverDogs and the Williamsport Crosscutters. The Redbirds are the Triple-A affiliate of the St. Louis Cardinals in the Pacific Coast League and play at AutoZone Park in Memphis, Tenn. The RiverDogs are the Class-A affiliate of the New York Yankees in the South Atlantic League and play at Joseph P. Riley Park in Charleston, S.C. The Crosscutters are the Class-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies in the New York-Penn League and play at BB&T Ballpark at Historic Bowman Field in Williamsport, Penn., home of the Major League Baseball Little League Classic.

Peter currently serves on the Board of Directors of both the Pacific Coast League and New York-Penn League, where he is a member of their respective Executive Committees. Further. he is the President of the Redbirds Community Fund, an organization which supports the Memphis RBI program (Reviving Baseball in Inner Cities), along with numerous community outreach initiatives.

Peter graduated from the Horace Mann School in Riverdale. N.Y. and received his Bachelor of Arts degree from Dartmouth College in Hanover, N.H. Peter is a trustee of the Rippowam Cisqua School, a coeducational independent day school for grades pre-kindergarten through nine, which he also attended. Peter resides in Bedford, N.Y. and Big Sky, Mont. with his wife, Mimi, and their twin daughters.

CRAIG UNGER PRESIDENT AND GENERAL MANAGER

Craig Unger was named the General Manager of the Memphis Redbirds in April 2014, and he added the title of President in 2016. As the Redbirds' President/GM, Unger is responsible for running the dayto-day operations of the Cardinals' Triple-A affiliate and AutoZone Park. In December 2016, Redbirds Principal Owner Peter

Freund announced that Unger joined the ownership group for the franchise, along with Freund and the St. Louis Cardinals.

In January 2018, Unger and Freund announced plans to bring a United Soccer League franchise to Memphis and AutoZone Park, with USL Memphis beginning play at the downtown stadium in 2019.

In four seasons in Memphis, Unger has directed numerous advancements with the franchise, including significant renovations and upgrades, which in part led to a 17 percent increase in attendance from the 2015 season to the 2016 season. That increase was fourth in all of Minor League Baseball, and the per-game change led the minors. The club built on that during the 2017 season, as its average home attendance rose an additional eight percent and included three crowds of 10,000 or more and 11 crowds above 7,500.

Before joining the Redbirds, Unger spent five years with the St. Louis Cardinals Front Office as an Account Executive, Corporate Sales and Marketing. In the position, Unger sold and managed corporate sponsorships, and oversaw club radio promotion and advertising, among other notable achievements. Upon joining the Cardinals in 2008. Unger was tasked with bringing the team's radio advertising in-house. From there, he played an essential role in returning the team's radio broadcasts to KMOX (1120 AM) in 2010. Additional accomplishments included serving as the field producer for the 2009 All-Star Game at Busch Stadium, coordinating the 2011 World Series Victory Parade and leading the team's marketing committee.

In 2013, Unger was integral in securing a long-term partnership with St. Louis-based Mercy as the Official Medical Provider of the St. Louis Cardinals. The deal gave the team access to a nationally recognized hospital, as well as an increased level of comprehensive, advanced care that is only possible from one of the leading health systems.

Maintaining his role as Account Executive, Unger also spent six months behind-the-scenes working on the acquisition of the Redbirds.

Prior to his time with the Cardinals, Unger spent nine years (1998-2007) in various positions at KTRS Radio including the role of Station Manager.

In his spare time, Unger enjoys cooking and barbecuing. He graduated from Webster University in 1998 with a Bachelor of Arts in Communications. Unger, along with his wife, Pamela, and three daughters, Emma, Ellen and Eden, resides in Memnhis

sselby@memphisredbirds.com Selby has been a part of the Redbirds broadcast team since 2000, broadcasting the inaugural game at AutoZone Park, His arrival in Memphis followed stints with the Kinston Eagles (1986), Durham Bulls (1987-90), Sumter Flyers (1991), Huntsville Stars (1992-95), and Nashville Sounds (1996-99). The Virginia native enters his 33rd season in the booth and has been at the microphone for more than 2,000 games as a member of the Redbirds. In 2017, Selby broadcast the 4,000th minor league game of his career.

In addition to his baseball work, Steve has also served as the play-by-play voice of Belmont University's men's basketball team, television voice of the Vanderbilt Commodores football and basketball programs

@SelbyRedbirds as well as calling action for the TSSAA football and basketball championships. In 2004, he called the NAIA National Championship football game on nationwide television. Selby's baseball background dates back to his collegiate days at

Randolph-Macon College in Ashland, Virginia where he graduated in 1978. In 2013, Steve was the TV voice for Lipscomb University with the games being aired on ESPN3. Selby also provided play-by-play

for the Ohio Valley Conference Basketball Tournament. He broadcast the first two rounds of the Men's Tournament and called the Women's Championship Game on ESPN3.

2017 REBRANDING

The Memphis Redbirds unveiled a new brand identity on Jan. 18, 2017 that speaks directly to the soul of the city and its rich traditions.

The primary logo replicates that of a neon street sign, quickly calling to mind Memphis' iconic Beale Street, located just a few blocks from the ballpark. The tube lighting is applied elsewhere throughout the brand package, including in the primary word mark and the numbers seen on the jerseys. Both the home and away uniforms feature the neon "Memphis" across the front with the neon "M" formed in the shape of a music note, to honor the home of the blues and the birthplace of rock 'n' roll.

"Upon purchasing the Redbirds, our first priority was to reconnect as a local business operating in downtown Memphis," said Principal Owner Peter Freund. "In doing so, we felt we needed an authentic brand that represented not only the storied history of Memphis, but the heart of the city itself."

"Throughout this process, we wanted to create a brand that we could activate," said President/General Manager Craig Unger. "The new, more modern look pays homage to Memphis' rich baseball heritage while keeping the connection to our St. Louis Cardinals affiliation. We have achieved this balance by maintaining the Redbirds name and color scheme, but also bringing back elements such as the music note "M' from the 1970s."

In order to successfully capture this essence of Memphis, the Redbirds turned to Dan Simon of Studio Simon for design.

"We were tremendously excited when the Redbirds came to Studio Simon and asked us to work together with them to create a brand identity that celebrated Memphis in a manner that evoked the unique flavor of such an incredible city, one that is a destination in and of itself," said Dan Simon. "And to be able to marry that look with a nod to, and update of, one of the St. Louis Cardinals' wonderful heritage logos was certainly delicious icing on the branding cake."

The primary colors of the new brand are St. Louis Cardinals red, navy and yellow, to represent the affiliate of the Redbirds since 1998. There are two primary hat versions: a red home hat featuring a more modern take on Rockey the Redbird's head, and the iconic music note neon "M" on a blue hat with a red bill. Fans will note a faint yellow outline around the jersey elements, which gives the effect that the neon is turned on.

Rockey has also been modernized as an edgy, bold and determined character, which embodies the spirit of Memphians. And the Redbirds are proud to bring back an iteration of Rockey as the Cardinals' famous "Dirty Bird," which will be featured on alternate powder blue jerseys the Cardinals made popular during the 1980s.

JOHN MOZELIAK • PRESIDENT OF BASEBALL OPERATIONS



John "Mo" Mozeliak was named President of Baseball Operations on June 30, 2017, the first to be named to that position in franchise history. Mozeliak had served as the team's Senior Vice President and General Manager for almost 10 full seasons, since October, 2007. He was the 12th general manager in the over 125-year history of the St. Louis Cardinals, and had previously held the position of Assis-

tant General Manager for six seasons. His contract runs through the 2020 season. Under Mozeliak, the Cardinals have reached the postseason six times, including five-straight seasons from 2011-2015, the first time in team history the club had reached the playoffs in five consecutive seasons. During that run, the Cardinals won three-straight National League Central Division titles (2013-2015), and have won four N.L. Central Titles overall (also 2009) under Mo's leadership. The five-year postseason run began with St. Louis' 11th World Championship in 2011.

The 2017 season was the Cardinals 10th-consecutive winning season, a streak that began when Mozeliak was named General Manager prior to the 2008 season. The Cardinals 897 wins in those 10 seasons under Mozeliak's watch are third only to the New York Yankees (910) and Los Angeles Dodgers (900). Two Cardinals affiliates won their respective league championships last season with the Memphis Redbirds winning a record 97 games and the Pacific Coast League crown, and the Palm Beach Cardinals sharing the Florida State League title after the championship series was cancelled due to weather.

A consistent culture of retaining key players has resulted in several significant deals aimed at keeping the organization's top talent in St. Louis. Since 2012, the club has worked out multi-year deals with All-Stars Yadier Molina (2012 & 2017), Carlos Martinez (2017), Matt Carpenter (2014), Adam Wainwright (2013), and inked Kolten Wong (2016) and Paul DeJong (2018) to multi-year deals as well. Mozeliak engineered a series of late season moves in 2011 that transformed the Cardinals and saw the team go from 10 ½ games back in late August to winning the franchise's 11th World Championship. Baseball America named the Cardinals the 2011 Organization of the Year, the first time the franchise had received the honor. Mo was the 2011 recipient of the MLB.com GIBBY (Greatness in Baseball Yearly) Executive of the Year award and he was named, along with Tony La Russa, as the 2011 Baseball Man of the Year by the St. Louis Chapter of the Baseball Writers Association of America.

In 2012, after the selection of Mike Matheny as manager, the Cardinals fell just one win shy of capturing the N.L. Championship, and with the team's success, Mo was honored by the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum with the Andrew "Rube" Foster Award as Executive of the Year. The 2013 team won the National League Championship and returned to the World Series just two years removed from winning the World Series title in 2011. Following that season, the organization was recognized by Baseball America as the Organization of the Year - the second such honor in three years - and was honored by USA Today Sports as having the best franchise among Major League baseball teams. The 2014 team captured the Central Division title for a second-straight season and returned to the National League Championship Series for a fourth-straight year. St. Louis led all Major League Baseball teams in wins and reached the postseason for a fifth-straight season in 2015, the ninth time in franchise history a Cardinals team had won 100 games.

Mozeliak, 49, is a 23-year veteran of the Cardinals front office, having joined the organization following the 1995 season where he initially served as an assistant in scouting operations during both the 1996 and 1997 seasons. Mo was named assistant scouting director in 1998 and was promoted to scouting director during 1999 and 2000. Several notable players came out of the draft classes of '99 and 2000 under Mo's direction, most notably first baseman and perennial All-Star Albert Pujols who was drafted in the 13th round of the 1999 draft, as well as catcher Yadier Molina.

In 2001, Mozeliak was named Director of Baseball Operations and in 2003 he was promoted to Assistant General Manager. During his time as Assistant GM, Mo's duties increased as he focused more on the Major League Club and professional scouting, while still having direct involvement in both the scouting and player development departments.

Mozeliak began his career in baseball in 1993 with the Colorado Rockies where he worked in a variety of positions in baseball operations. He attended the University of Arizona and the University of Colorado. He currently serves as the National Trustee for the Foundation Fighting Blindness, is an active fund raiser for American Parkinson Disease Association and sits on the Mercy Hospital Foundation board. Mozeliak lives in St. Louis with his wife, Julie, daughter, Allyson, and son, Will.

MIKE GIRSCH • VICE PRESIDENT AND GENERAL MANAGER



Michael Girsch was promoted to Vice President and General Manager on June 30, 2017, becoming the 13th General Manager in franchise history. His contract as General Manager runs through the 2020 season, and he is responsible for handling the day-to-day work of the team, including coordinating the efforts of the team's baseball development group. contract negotiations, player evaluations.

tions and player transactions.

Prior to his appointment as GM, Girsch served as Cardinals Assistant General Manager for seven seasons after being appointed to that position in January 2011. Girsch joined the Cardinals in 2006, starting his career with a two year stint as the Coordinator of Amateur Scouting.

In 2008, Girsch was named Director of Baseball Development, a newly created department focused on supporting Baseball Op-

erations via internet applications, analytical models and decision support tools. He led the department for three years before his promotion to Assistant GM, and has continued to guide the group into his current expanded role.

Before he joined the Cardinals, Girsch, 41, earned a Bachelor

of Science in Mathematics from the University of Notre Dame and an MBA from the University of Chicago Booth School of Business. He and his wife, Kelly, reside in Webster Groves with their four children, twins Addison and Eleanor (13), Claire (11) and Tommy (10).

MOISES RODRIGUEZ • ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER



Moisés Rodriguez was named the team's Assistant General Manager on September 27, 2017. Rodriguez has been a part of the organization for 10 seasons as the Director of International Operations. In his role as Assistant General Manager, Rodriguez will assist both the President of Baseball Operations and VP & General Manager with M

jor League player transactions, contract negotiations and player evaluations, and will help oversee all aspects of Baseball Operations including amateur and pro scouting, player development, international operations and baseball development.

Before becoming Assistant GM, Rodriguez directed the team's amateur scouting effort overseas, and supervised the player development and facility operations at the Cardinals Dominican Republic Academy. During his tenure, the international scouting department identified Cardinal pitchers Carlos Martinez and Alex Reyes as well as the late Oscar Taveras. The department also identified players such as Sandy Alcantara, Magneuris Sierra,

Luis Perdomo, and Allen Cordoba. Under his supervision, the Cardinals moved into a newly built player development academy in Boca Chica, Dominican Republic in 2015.

Prior to joining the Cardinals, Rodriguez worked for Major League Baseball in New York from 1998-2007, the last three-plus years as Manager of International Baseball Operations in the Commissioner's Office. During his tenure in the Commissioner's Office, he also specialized in the day-to-day handling of the waiver wire and rule enforcement related to clubs' Major and Minor League Player movement transactions. His first position at MLB in 1998 was as an assistant in Media Relations and waivers for the National League office. He began his work in sports as an Assistant Director of Sports Information at the University of Connecticut.

Rodriguez, 44, was born in Hato Rey, Puerto Rico before moving to New York City. He received a communications degree from the University of Connecticut. He and his wife, Michelle, have two sons: Moisés Angel (9) and Christian (5).

GARY LAROCQUE • DIRECTOR OF PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Gary LaRocque was named Director of player Development prior to the 2014 season and in this role oversees all aspects of player development. LaRocque joined the St. Louis organization in 2008 as Senior Special Assistant to the General Manager and was named Senior Advisor to Player Development prior to the 2013 season.

LaRocque is in his 43rd year in professional baseball in player development and scouting. He served in senior management levels for the New York Mets beginning in 1998 as Scouting

Director, Assistant General Manager, VP Player Development & Scouting and was Vice President of Professional Scouting in 2006.

Before joining the Mets, LaRocque started his professional playing career as an infielder in 1975 with the Milwaukee Brewers, and in 1979 began a 19-year career with the Los Angeles Dodgers as a minor league coach. LaRocque was a manager in the minors through 1988 before moving into the Dodgers' scouting department from 1989-97. LaRocque acquired his degree in secondary education (mathematics) in 1975 from the University of Hartford, West Hartford, Conn., and was elected to the Athletic Hall of Fame at the University of Hartford in 1993.

RANDY FLORES • DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING

Randy Flores was named the Cardinals Director of Scouting on August 28, 2015. Flores oversees all aspects of the scouting department including the amateur draft. Prior to joining the Cardinals front office, Flores founded a sports technology company that provided customized video and data integration to assist in the instruction

and evaluation of amateur players.

Drafted in 1997 from the University of Southern California as its all-time wins leader (42), he returned to USC to earn a M.Ed Postsecondary Administration in 2014. During graduate school, he was USC's Pitching Coach (2013) and worked as a college

baseball analyst for ESPN and Pac-12 Networks.

Flores, 42, was part of the Cardinals 2006 World Series Championship team and spent eight seasons in the Majors. The left-hander played for St. Louis from 2004-08, appearing in over 200 games as a relief pitcher. Drafted by the New York Yankees, Flores made his Major League debut in 2002 with the Texas Rangers and also saw big league action with Colorado (2002, 2009-10) and Minnesota (2010).

A native of Pico Rivera, Calif., Flores and his wife, Lindsey, reside in St. Louis with their two daughters, Sloane (8) and Rowan (6), and newborn son Hawkins.



JOHN VUCH • DIRECTOR OF BASEBALL ADMINISTRATION

John Vuch is in his 31st season in Baseball Operations and 40th overall with the Cardinals. He was named to his current position following the 2013 season and he assists the VP/General Manager in all aspects of the Major League club, including taking the lead on arbitration cases, as well as handling contract negotiations for some of the

40-man roster players and minor league free agents.

Vuch held the title of Farm Director from September 2010 through the 2012 seasons, and during that time oversaw Championships for three teams [Quad Cities (A) & Johnson City (R) in 2011, Springfield (AA) in 2012]. The two championships in 2011 marked the first time since 1994 multiple Cardinals mi-

nor league affiliates won league championships, and the 2012 Springfield Cardinal team was recognized as the Minor League Team of the Year. Under his leadership, the 2010 Cardinals Minor League system had the highest combined winning percentage of any Major League organization and the Cardinals were recognized as the 2011 Organization of the Year by Baseball America. At the conclusion of the 2012 season, the Cardinals minor league system was ranked #1 by Baseball Prospectus, Baseball America and ESPN. He served as Director of Minor League Operations in 2013 and 2007-2010, and was responsible for the daily operations of the Cardinals' farm system including minor league player personnel decisions. He began working for the Cardinals as a "runner" in 1979 and worked in the Sales Department from 1985 to 1987.

Vuch was awarded the 2009 Harry Mitauer Good Guy Award by the St. Louis chapter of the BBWAA of America at their 51st annual dinner.

A St. Louis native, Vuch graduated from Oakville

High School and the University of Missouri-St. Louis with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration. Vuch and his wife, Maria, reside in south St. Louis County and have three children: Jack (23), Hayley (20) and Anna (17).

MIKE JORGENSEN • SENIOR SPECIAL ASSISTANT TO THE GENERAL MANAGER



Mike Jorgensen has served as a Special Assistant to the General Manager since September 2001. He was Director of Player Development for 10 seasons (1992-01), and was the team's minor league hitting instructor/coordinator in 1990 and 1991.

Upon retiring as a player after the 1985 season, 'Jorgy' was hired as an instructor in the Cardinals' minor league system and was a minor league manager from 1986-89. He made his big-league managerial debut following the dismissal of Cardinals skipper Joe Torre on June 16, 1995, and guided the team to a 41-55 mark. While managing the field operations, he also remained in his post as Director of Player Development.

Jorgensen was a left-handed-hitting first baseman/ outfielder during a major league career that spanned 18 seasons. He was selected by the New York Mets in the June 1966 free-agent draft and made his big-league debut in 1968. He was traded to Montreal at the start of the 1972 season, his first of five full seasons with the Expos. He went on to play for Oakland, Texas, the Mets again. Atlanta and St. Louis.

Jorgensen, 69, graduated from Francis Lewis High School in Flushing, N.Y., attended St. John's University and served from 1967-72 in the United States Marine Corps Reserve. He and his wife, Melissa Lee, make their home in St. Louis. Jorgensen and his late wife, Brenda, have three married children; Brian, Kristen and Eric, four grandsons: Eric, Jacob, James and Owen, and two granddaughters: Quinn Ann and Clara Marie.

BOB GEBHARD • SENIOR SPECIAL ASSISTANT TO THE GENERAL MANAGER



Bob Gebhard joined the Cardinals in 2017 as Sr. Special Assistant to Sr. VP/ General Manager John Mozeliak, and is in his 54th season in professional baseball. He came to St. Louis after 12 seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks as Vice President & Special Assistant to the GM, the same role he held with the Cardinals from 2000-04.

Gebhard was on the ground floor of the Colorado Rockies franchise, joining the club during the winter of 1991 as the first General Manager in the team's history. He joined the Rockies from the Minnesota Twins where he won a pair of World Series rings in 1987 and 1991.

Gebhard was drafted by the Twins in the 15th round of the first June draft in 1965 and had an 11-year playing career with both the Twins and Montreal Expos. He was a player/coach in the Montreal organization from 1974- 75, then coached in Montreal's system through 1986, including on the Major League coaching staff in 1982.

In 2012, Gebhard received the Roland Hemond Award from the Society of American Baseball Research (SABR) and in 2011 was named the recipient of the Sheldon "Chief" Bender Award from Minor League Baseball.

A native of Lamberton, Minn., Gebhard earned 16 letters in four sports in high school. His athletic career continued at the University of lowa, where he co-captained the baseball team and played basketball. Gebhard and his wife, Nancy, reside in Centennial, Colo., and have three children, Angie, Jenny and Casey, and eight grandchildren.

MATT SLATER • SPECIAL ASSISTANT TO THE GM, PLAYER PROCUREMENT



Matt Slater joined the Cardinals in 2007 and was named Special Assistant to the General Manager, Player Procurement in December 2017

He is in his 28th year in Major League Baseball where over the course of his ca-

reer, he has helped build division winners and playoff teams in Baltimore, Los Angeles and St. Louis. In his current role as senior talent evaluator, Slater works hand in hand with the General Manager in all player acquisitions including Major League, minor league, amateur draft and international talent. Furthermore, he aids in contract negotiations and roster composition. For the past 10 years, Matt has served as a consultant to the Orix Buffaloes Baseball Club of Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball league. In addition, Slater continues to push the Cardinal organization forward in the emerging player procurement markets of Asia and Cuba.

Prior to joining the Cardinals, Slater served in various management capacities for the Los Angeles Dodgers for nine years, including Director of Scouting Operations, Director of Baseball Operations and Director of Professional Scouting. With the Dodgers, he oversaw scouting operations while also being involved with contract negotiations, arbitration and roster management. He worked with the Baltimore Orioles from 1995-98 as the Administrator of Scouting. Slater got his start in professional baseball with the Milwaukee

Brewers when he was 19 years old. Beginning in 1991, he served as the Brewers' Scouting and Player Development Assistant.

A native of Fort Wayne, Ind., Slater graduated from Marquette University in Milwaukee, Wis. in 1993, with a degree in Business Administration — Organizational Management, and holds a law degree from Southwestern Law School in Los Angeles, Calif. He serves on the board of directors for Independence Center, a non-profit mental health facility in St. Louis. He resides in Chesterfield with his wife, Thomasine, and their three children, Brandon (17), Madison (14) and Jacob (14).

Mark DeJohn enters his eighth season as Field Coordinator and has coached or managed in the St. Louis organization in all but one year dating back to 1986.

A native of Middletown, CT, DeJohn was drafted by New York (N) in 1971 and spent seven seasons as an infielder in the Mets system be-

fore signing with Detroit in 1978. He made his Major League debut on April 28, 1982 and appeared in 24 games for the Tigers. DeJohn made the transition from player to coach in 1983, when he became a minor league instructor for the Tigers. He began his managerial career in 1985 at Double-A Birmingham before joining the Cardinals organization in 1986. He returned to the Tigers for a season in 1992 to manage their Double-A affiliate in London, before returning to St. Louis to serve as field coordinator from 1993-95.

DeJohn was a member of Tony LaRussa's coaching staff with the Cardinals in LaRussa's first six seasons at the helm. He then went on to manage at multiple levels of the Cardinals farm system from 2002-2009 prior to being named the Cardinals' roving minor league quality control coordinator in 2010.

In addition to Smith and Reyes, Richmond's Estrada, Collier and PawSox teammate Anton French homered for the IL while Oklahoma's Jason Jones hit a three-run blast in the sixth to complete the PCL's scoring and earn the League's "Star of Stars" Award.

Three IL batters had three hits each - "Star of Stars" Winner and Maurice LaCroix Lou Gehrig Batter-of-the-Game Estrada (3-3, 2B, HR, 3 RBI), Collier (3-5, HR, SB, 2 RBI) and French (3-5, HR, SB) - while no PCL batter had more than one. Columbus reliever Sam Marsonek worked a perfect fifth inning for the IL to earn Pitcher-of-the-Game honors





AUTOZONE PARK: HOME OF THE MEMPHIS REDBIRDS



AutoZone Park has drawn rave reviews across the nation from publications such as USA Today, Sports Illustrated, Southern Living, Sports Business Journal and Baseball America, having been called "one of America's 10 Best Ballpark Vacation Destinations" and "a smaller version of Baltimore's Camden Yards."

By combining the feel of such parks as Wrigley Field, Fenway Park, and Camden Yards, AutoZone Park is a state-of-the-art facility with classic, neo-traditional style and is one of the finest ballparks ever built below the Major League level.

ARCHITECT: Memphis' Looney Ricks Kiss Architects was the lead architectural firm. They used Kansas City-based HOK Sports, who have designed more Major League ballparks than any architectural firm in the country, as consultants. AutoZone Park has drawn comparisons to Baltimore's Camden Yards, which was also designed by HOK Sports.

LOCATION: AutoZone Park is centrally located in downtown Memphis and covers more than two full city blocks, with the main entrance right across the street from the famous Peabody Hotel and two blocks north of Beale Street. The building of the stadium is often credited with helping revitalizing of the stadium is often credited with helping revitalizing boom. It also furthered minor league baseball's trend of building stadiums downtown instead of in the suburbs. In the summer of 2001, Peabody Place, a long-awaited shopping and entertainment complex, opened just a block away. Echelon at the Ballpark, a 380-unit luxury apartment complex now known as Fielder Square Downtown, opened outside AutoZone Park's outfield walls, and a new elementary school was built by the Memphis City Schools System just one block northeast of the ballpark.

FIRST GAMES: The first game at AutoZone Park was played on April 1, 2000, when the St. Louis Cardinals came to Mem-

phis for an exhibition matchup that they won, 10-6 in front of a standing-room only crowd. The Redbirds hosted the lowa Cubs on April 14, 2000 in the first regular-season game, winning, 14-3.

2003 TRIPLE-A ALL-STAR GAME: Memphis played host to the Triple-A All-Star Game between the All-Stars from the Pacific Coast League and the International League. Festivities started with an All-Star luncheon held on July 15 at the Peabody Hotel that featured keynote speaker and Hall of Fame broadcaster Ernie Harwell. The game was played on the next day, July 16, at AutoZone Park in front of 15,214 fans. The International League defeated the Pacific Coast League, 13-9. Three Redbirds played in the game, including shortstop Jason Bowers, right-hander Matt Duff, and right-hander Jason Ryan, who suffered the loss in the game.

2016 GILDAN TRIPLE-A NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME:

Memphis had the honor of hosting the 2016 Gildan Triple-A National Championship Game, which pitted the winners of the Pacific Coast League, the El Paso Chihuahuas, against the winners of the International League, the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders. Scranton won, 3-1, in front of a near sellout crowd of 9,471 at AutoZone Park.

SEATING: AutoZone Park is home to 8,404 seats for fans to enjoy a Redbirds ballgame. 1,500 of these are found on the Bluffs, two areas of grass-covered lawn seating in each corner of the stadium that provides a picnic-like atmosphere. Tickets are sold cheaply for the Bluff, but any types of chairs are not allowed in this area

AutoZone Park also offers two levels of luxury suites, 29 in total. These, as well as the almost 1,800 club seats, have access to the Club Level, which provides an air-conditioned atrium and specialty foods.

AUTOZONE PARK: HOME OF THE MEMPHIS REDBIRDS

VIDEOBOARD: In the Spring of 2012, the Redbirds unveiled a new video scoreboard, one that has a display that is more than five times the size of the previous video display at AutoZone Park. The videoboard was built by Daktronics and is 3,600 square feet $(60' \times 60')$, surpassing Buffalo's 2,640 square feet board as the largest in minor league baseball. Weighing at over 20 tons, the new board stands 127 feet (13 stories) above the playing field and contains 1,440,000 pixels. However, it uses less power and is more environmentally friendly than the previous video display.

CONCESSIONS: Memphis is known as one of the tastiest towns in the Mid-South, and AutoZone Park helps uphold this reputation. The Official Concessionaire of the Memphis Redbirds and AutoZone Park is Delaware North. With over 30 concession outlets and 200 menu items, there is something for everyone at the ballpark. AutoZone Park's BBQ Nachos have been rated among the Top 10 Minor League Ballpark Foods by Sports Illustrated, and the stadium was named as a Top 10 Vegetarian Ballpark by PETA in 2007 and from 2011-14.

AUTOZONE PARK: 2014 OFFSEASON RENOVATIONS

The Memphis Redbirds made multi-million dollar renovations and major enhancements to AutoZone Park over the 2014 offseason.

As part of the 2014 long-term lease agreement between the St. Louis Cardinals and the city of Memphis, \$4.5 million in bond proceeds were set aside to make capital improvements to AutoZone Park. The Cardinals added more than \$2 million in additional capital improvement money to fund significant state-of-the-art features and fan-friendly amenities that transformed the park prior to the 2015 season.

In a continuing effort to improve the overall fan experience, ballpark renovations made by the Cardinals included the installation of a state-of-the-art LED Videoboard in left field, LED ribbon board displays, thirty-nine "Four Top Tables", a right field destination BBQ food area, a new left field bar, additional berm seating, an expanded and upgraded club level, AutoZone Park's first all-inclusive club in right field, playing field replacement and more.

Renovations were completed by Montgomery Martin Contractors of Memphis, while Architecture designs were provided by Pendulum Studio II LLC of Kansas City.

RENOVATION PROJECT DETAILS

NEW STATE-OF-THE-ART LED VIDEOBOARD DISPLAYS: Complementing the existing videoboard in right field, fans will get a complete multimedia experience at AutoZone Park with the addition of a new 14' x 140' HD LED Video Wall in Left Field and two new 3' x 150' HD LED Ribbon Boards along the first and third base façades within the seating bowl. The video wall and ribbon boards will provide better views, sponsorship activation, in-game entertainment, and game information.

NEW ALL-INCLUSIVE CLUB IN RIGHT FIELD (2ND FLOOR): Four existing suites in right field were removed to create AutoZone Park's first public all-inclusive area, which will feature retractable windows, a full service bar, indoor/outdoor seating, pool tables, and TVs. Tickets to this premium indoor group space will include all food, Coca-Cola products, draft beer, and house wines.

NEW RIGHT FIELD DESTINATION FOOD AREA: A BBQ-themed free-standing structure will be constructed on the outfield concourse in right field.

RELOCATED BERM SEATING: Fixed seats in the left field and right field corners were removed to create two new grass berm seating areas to maintain affordable tickets that are closer to the action on the field and fan amenities.

NEW LEFT FIELD BAR: Stairs were removed in the left field corner and replaced with a covered destination bar structure that includes high top tables, drink rails, and TVs.

CLUB EXPANSION BEHIND HOME PLATE (2ND FLOOR): Four existing suites behind home plate were removed to create a more vibrant club atmosphere and signature view of AutoZone park for both baseball and non-baseball events. This improved and larger indoor group space will feature retractable windows, more TVs, and a full service 360-degree bar.

ADDITION OF THIRTY-NINE (39) "FOUR TOP TABLES": Private, semi-circle table configurations consisting of four, 360-degree swiveling stadium seats located in four sections (201-204) on the Club Level above home plate. Each table features included pregame buffet, in seat service, and Coca-Cola beverages.

INTERIOR RENOVATION OF PREMIUM SUITES: Twenty-nine (29) suites will be renovated with replaced floor covering, new lounge furniture, drink rails, casework, wall and ceiling finishes.

UPGRADED EXISTING SIGNAGE: Selective non-digital signage, way-finding, and graphics visible to patrons on the main concourse and suite levels will be upgraded.

AUTOZONE PARK: 2014 OFFSEASON RENOVATIONS

EXPANDED BACKSTOP NETTING BEHIND HOME PLATE: The extent of the netting behind home plate will be expanded to protect an increased number of patrons.

PLAYING FIELD REPLACEMENT: Playing surface renovation and full-scale field makeover: Existing grass, dirt, and organic material will be removed. New sand base will be installed for the field, sod, infield, and warning track. This marks the first full-scale field makeover since installation in 2000.

EXPANDED CONCOURSE: The most heavily trafficked areas of the main concourse will be expanded to improve traffic flow.

VARIOUS CONCOURSE IMPROVEMENTS: Additional TV screens added to concourses and public areas around the stadium. Concession stands throughout the main concourse will also receive various upgrades.

MEDIA RELATIONS POLICIES & PROCEDURES

On behalf of the Memphis Redbirds, welcome to the 2018 Pacific Coast League (PCL) season at AutoZone Park. Our goal is to make your job covering the Redbirds as convenient as possible.

CREDENTIALS

- Credentials for Redbirds games at AutoZone Park are available upon request for legitimate news-gathering organizations.
- To guarantee timely processing, a credential application from an editor, sports director/producer, or assignment editor should be submitted at least 24 hours in advance of the requested date to Mollie Shultz at mshultz@memphisredbirds.com.
- Credentials may be picked up at the Will Call window located at AutoZone Park's main gate at Union Avenue and B.B. King Boulevard.
- No spouses, guests, or children of media members will be issued credentials. Redbirds credentials are non-transferable.
- All credentials must be worn in a visible manner at all times.
- Any violation of these guidelines may result in immediate revocation of the credential and future access
- Only credentials issued by the Memphis Redbirds, St. Louis Cardinals, Pacific Coast League, Major League Baseball, or Minor League Baseball will be honored.

AUTOGRAPHS

 Any media member requesting autographs, personal photographs, or equipment on the playing field or in the dugout or clubhouse from players or coaches will have their press access revoked.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

- Photographers are allowed on the field during games only with proper field photo pass issued by the Memphis Redbirds.
- Photographers must work out of the camera bays located at the far ends of each dugout. Chairs are available in each dugout.
- When exiting the field, please use the gate leading to the stands at the far end of each dugout.
- If you wish to switch dugouts, please wait until the halfinning is complete and walk along the track behind home plate to the other side.
- Do not enter the playing field at any time.
- No still photographers are allowed in either clubhouse at any time.
- Freelance photographers' credential requests will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

CLUBHOUSE ACCESS

- Access to the Redbirds clubhouse before and after games will be limited to organizations that are filing on a nightly deadline.
- All other media outlets will be asked to conduct interviews on the field prior to game time.
- Clubhouse access will be granted to all media when special situations arise, as determined by the Memphis Redbirds.
- Access to the Redbirds clubhouse will be available to media with proper credentials issued by the Memphis Redbirds. NO OTHER CREDENTIAL WILL BE HONORED.
- Pre-game access to the clubhouse will be determined by the Redbirds field staff.
- At the latest, the clubhouse will be closed to all media 60 minutes prior to all games and will re-open 10 minutes after the game ends.
- The clubhouse is not accessible during rain delays and between games of a doubleheader, unless otherwise arranged with the Redbirds Media Relations Department.
- At times, certain additional restrictions may be imposed for meetings, cooling-off periods, etc.
- THE TRAINING ROOM AND WEIGHT ROOM ARE CLOSED TO ALL MEDIA AT ALL TIMES.

FIELD ACCESS

- All credentialed media members will be given access to the playing field prior to each game.
- Field and dugouts must be clear of all media representatives 30 minutes prior to game time. Photographers must take their assigned positions at that time.

INTERVIEWS

- Interviews can be held prior to and following Redbirds games
- The field staff and the players are usually available on the field or in the clubhouse during batting practice as long as the interview does not interrupt their pre-game routine (stretching, hitting, running, infield, etc.).
- Pre-game interviews must be completed at the conclusion of the visiting team's batting practice unless that individual has credentials for in-game privileges (photo pass). Please notify a Redbirds Media Relations representative for arrangements.
- Media are asked not to lounge in the clubhouse or conduct full-length interviews after a game unless pre-arranged with the Redbirds Media Relations Department.

PRESS BOX

- The AutoZone Park press box is located behind home plate on the third floor Press Level.
- All workstations have electrical outlets and are equipped with outside phone access.
- Press box seating is available to accredited members of the working media on assignment only.
- Any person under the age of 18 is prohibited from entering the press box on game days without prior approval from the Redbirds Media Relations Department.
- Guests are not allowed in the press box without prior approval from the Redbirds Media Relations Department.

MEDIA LOUNGE

- The Media Lounge is located inside the writers' area in the press box.
- Refreshments and pre-game meals are available to all accredited working media until the end of the 2nd inning.

GAME INFORMATION

- Both club's game notes, statistical information, press releases, roster sheets, and pertinent news releases from both teams will be made available.
- Media notes are usually available in the press box at least two hours before game time.
- Starting lineups are distributed as soon as they are available from both teams.
- The game's box score and play-by-play will be available shortly after the conclusion of the game.
- Game notes and other information are available for online viewing at www.memphisredbirds.com.

WIRELESS INTERNET

 Complimentary wireless internet access is available in the press box. Contact the Redbirds Media Relations Department for details.

<u>ALCOHOL</u>

 Alcoholic beverages are prohibited from the working press box prior to or during the game at all times.

DRESS CODE

- The media should dress in an appropriate and professional manner proper for a business casual work environment when in clubhouses, dugouts, press boxes, and on the field.
- Cheering, rooting or clapping of any kind for either team in the press box shall result in credential revocation and ejection from the ballpark.

BASEBALL CALCULATIONS

ASSISTS: An assist shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects a batted or thrown ball in such a way that a putout results, or would have resulted except for a subsequent error by any fielder. Only one assist and no more shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects the ball in a run-down play which results in a putout, or would have resulted in a putout, except for a subsequent error.

BATTING AVERAGE: Divide the numbers of at-bats into the number of hits.

SLUGGING PERCENTAGE: Divide the total bases of all safe hits by the total number of at-bats.

ON BASE PERCENTAGE: Take the total number of hits, walks, and hit-by-pitches and divide by the total number of at-bats, walks, hit-by-pitches, and sacrifice flies. Times awarded first base on interference or obstruction are not figured into on base percentage.

CONSECUTIVE GAME HITTING STREAK: A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if all the player's plate appearances result in a walk, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if the player has a sacrifice fly and no hit.

CONSECUTIVE GAMES PLAYED STREAK: A consecutive-game streak shall extend if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance shall not extend the streak. If a player is ejected from a game by an umpire before he complies with the requirements of this rule, his streak shall continue.

DETERMINING THE MAGIC NUMBER: Determine the number of games yet to be played, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead in the lost column of the standings from the closest opponent.

DOCTORED BAT: If filled or "doctored" bat is used, the player is to be called out and ejected from the game and is subject to additional penalties. Any balls hit by an illegal bat do not count. If the umpire sees the illegal bat before it is used, he issues a warning, but there is no penalty.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE: Multiply earned runs by 9 and then divide by innings pitched.

FIELDING PERCENTAGE: Divide the total putouts and assists by total putouts, assists and errors.

SAVES: Credit a pitcher with a save when he meets all three of the following conditions:

- 1. He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club; and
- 2. He is not the winning pitcher; and
- 3. He qualifies under one of the following conditions:
 - He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; or
 - He enters the game, regardless of the count, with the potential tying run either already on base, at bat or on deck; or
 - He must be credited with at least 1/3 of an inning pitched. No more than one save may be credited in each game.

WINNING PITCHER: The starting pitcher will be credited with the win only if he has pitched at least five complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead the remainder of the game. When the starting pitcher does not meet the preceding criteria and more than one relief pitcher is used, the victory shall be awarded on the following basis:

- When, during the tenure of the starting pitcher, the winning team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game, credit the victory to the relief pitcher judged by the scorer to have been the most effective.
- Whenever the score is tied, the game becomes a new contest insofar as the winning and losing pitcher is concerned.
- Once the opposing team assumes the lead, all pitchers who have pitched up to that point are excluded from being credited with the victory except the current pitcher.
- The winning relief pitcher shall be the one who is the pitcher of record when his team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game. EXCEPTION: Do not credit a victory to a relief pitcher who is ineffective in a brief appearance, when a succeeding relief pitcher pitches effectively in helping his team maintain the lead. In such cases credit the succeeding relief pitcher with the victory.

PCL ITEMS OF INTEREST

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE BATTING TITLE: To qualify for the PCL batting or slugging title, a player must have a minimum of 389 plate appearances or the equivalent to 2.7 plate appearances for each of the 144 scheduled games. However, a player with fewer than the required number of plate appearances whose average would be the highest if he were charged with the required number of plate appearances or official at-bats shall be awarded the batting or slugging championship.

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE ERA TITLE: To qualify for the ERA crown, a pitcher must have at least 115 innings pitched or the equivalent of 0.8 multiplied by the number of scheduled games (144).

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE CURFEW: There is no curfew in the Pacific Coast League. The game is in the hands of the umpire once it has started.

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE SUSPENDED GAMES: All performances in the completion of a suspended game shall be considered as occurring on the original date of the game.

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE NIGHT GAMES: Any game scheduled to start after 6:00 p.m. is considered a night game. A game scheduled to begin before 6:00 p.m., which is delayed by rain or any other reason, is still considered a day game. However, both games of a twi-night doubleheader will be considered night games.

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE ROSTER LIMITS: In the PCL rosters are limited to 25 players from Opening Day through the final day of the season and the playoffs. Players on the disabled list or on rehabilitation assignment do not count against the 25-man active roster. In the Major Leagues, rosters are 40 until Opening Day, when they decrease to 25. On September 1 major league rosters expand to 40 players.

EXTRA INNINGS:

- At all levels of Minor League Baseball, extra innings will begin with a runner on second base. The runner at second base will be the player in the batting order position previous to the leadoff batter of the inning (or a substitute for that player). By way of example, if the number five hitter in the batting order is due to lead off the 10th inning, the number four player in the batting order (or a pinch-runner for such player) shall begin the inning on second base. Any runner or batter removed from the game for a substitute shall be ineligible to return to the game, as is the case in all circumstances under the Official Baseball Rules.
- For purposes of calculating earned runs under Rule 9.16, the runner who begins an inning on second base pursuant to this rule shall be deemed to be a runner who has reached second base because of a fielding error, but no error shall be charged to the opposing team or to any player.

PITCHER'S MOUND VISITS:

- Visits by coaches and position players will be limited based on the classification level. Triple-A clubs will be allowed six (6) visits per team, Double-A clubs will be allowed eight (8) visits per team. Single-A clubs will be allowed 10 visits per team and there will not be a limit on mound visits for Short Season and Bookie-level clubs
- These mound visit limits will apply whether the game is scheduled for seven or nine innings.
- For any extra-innings played, each club shall be entitled to one additional non-pitching change mound visit per inning.
- Official Baseball Rule 5.10(I), which governs mound visits by a manager or coach, remains in effect (i.e., a pitcher must be removed on the second visit by a manager/coach in an inning).

Definition of Mound Visit:

- A manager or coach trip to the mound to meet with the pitcher shall constitute a visit. A player leaving his position to confer with the pitcher, including a pitcher leaving the mound to confer with another player, shall also constitute a mound visit, regardless of where the visit occurs or the length of the visit, except that the following shall not constitute mound visits:
- a. Discussions between pitchers and position players(s) that (i) occur between batters in the normal course of play and do not require either the position player(s) or the pitcher to relocate;
- b. Visits by position players to the mound to clean spikes in rainy conditions;
- c. Visits to the mound due to an injury or potential injury of the pitcher; and
- d. Visits to the mound after the announcement of an offensive substitution.

Cross-Up in Signs:

- In the event a team has exhausted its allotment of mound visits in a game (or extra inning) and the home plate umpire determines that the catcher and pitcher did not have a shared understanding of the location or type of pitch that had been signaled by the catcher (otherwise referred to as a "crossup"), the home plate umpire may, upon request of the catcher, allow the catcher to make a brief mound visit. Any mound visit resulting from a cross-up prior to a team exhausting its allotted number of visits shall count against a team's total number of allotted mound visits.

15-SECOND PITCH TIMER:

- Pitchers at the Triple-A and Double-A levels will be allowed 15 seconds to begin their wind-up or the motion to come to the set position when no runners are on base.
- The pitcher does not necessarily have to release the ball within 15 seconds, but must begin his wind-up or begin the motion to come to the set position to comply with the 15-second rule with no runners on base.
- With runners on base, the pitch timer will go from 15 to 20
- The timer shall start when the pitcher has possession of the ball in the dirt circle surrounding the pitcher's rubber, the catcher is in the catcher's box and the batter is in the dirt circle surrounding home plate.
- The timer will stop as soon as the pitcher begins his wind-up. or begins the motion to come to the set position.
- If the pitcher feints a pick-off or steps off the rubber with runners on base, the timer shall reset and start again immediately.
- Umpires have the authority to stop the pitch clock timer and order a reset.
- Following any event (e.g., pick-off play) that permits the batter to leave the batter's box, the timer shall start when the pitcher has possession of the ball in the dirt circle surrounding the pitcher's rubber, and the catcher is in the catcher's box.
- Following an umpire's call of "time" or if the ball becomes dead and the batter remains at-bat, the timer shall start after the next pitch or play.
- Should the pitcher fail to begin his wind-up or begin the motion to come to the set position in 15 seconds with no runners on base, or 20 seconds with a runner on base, a ball will be awarded to the count on the batter.
- Should the batter fail to be in the batter's box and alert to the pitcher with seven (7) or more seconds remaining on the pitch timer, a strike will be awarded to the count on the batter.
- The first 15 days of the season (April 5-19) will serve as a grace period, with players receiving warnings for infractions.
- Beginning April 20, rules will be enforced as written.
