LAST GAME:

MANCHESTER, NH -- The Thunder and New Hampshire Fisher Cats split a pseudo-doubleheader on Wednesday afternoon in Manchester with the Thunder earning a 3-2 win in the continuation of a suspended game from April 29 and dropping a seven-inning game, 3-2, at Northeast Delta Dental Stadium.

The teams picked up a suspended game in the bottom of the third inning from April 29, with the Thunder leading 3-0 and Gunnar Heidt standing on first with nobody out, and the visitors were able to pull out a 3-2 win. Right-hander Garrett Whitlock made his Double-A debut in relief of Erik Swanson with five scoreless innings. Whitlock kept the Fisher Cats off the board despite walking a career-high five batters in his time on the mound. Whitlock earned the win as James Reeves worked around a two-run home run to pinch-hitter Juan Kelly in the 9th inning to earn his third save of the season.

In the following seven-inning game, right-hander Brian Keller was brilliant through the first five innings as the Thunder offense managed two runs off the New Hampshire starter, Taylor Saucedo. Trey Amburgey and Billy Fleming began the third inning with back-to-back doubles to lead to the game's first run. The Thunder offense added a second run in the sixth off of Saucedo when Mandy Alvarez worked a two-out walk and Jeff Hendrix doubled him in with a shot off the wall in right-center.

With the 2-0 score, the Fisher Cats broke through to take the lead against Keller. A one out walk from Bo Bichette started offense and he promptly stole second. After a fly out led to the second out of the inning, Harold Ramirez doubled in Bichette with a shot to right-center. Then Cavan Biggio took a 3-1 offering over the wall in right-center for his Eastern League-leading 20th home run of the season. His two-run shot took a 3-2 lead for New Hampshire.

Travis Bergen entered and retired the side in order in the seventh inning to nail down his third save of the season.

THUNDER CLAPS:

PONY UP: When facing Binghamton this season, the Thunder have had the edge in the season series (6-4) as well as in statistical categories; the two teams' batting averages (Trenton's .289 vs Binghamton's .260) and ERAs (Trenton's 3.99 vs Binghamton's 5.86) contrast starkly within the season series.

BUCKLE UP: The Thunder are amid a 20-game stretch in which they play only Eastern Division rivals. Following the current two-city road trip, the team returns home to host Hartford and Portland beginning Monday, and then will embark on another two-city trip to Reading and Hartford. Thus far, only 20 of Trenton's 52 wins have come against the East.

UNDER PRESSURE: Over their last two games, the Thunder are batting just .167 (3-for-18) with runners in scoring position. As a team, Trenton is batting .242 with RISP, and just .218 with RISP and two out.

SO CLOSE: Each of the Thunder's last seven losses have come by margins of two or fewer runs. In four of those defeats, the Thunder have either placed the go-ahead/winning run on base, or brought it to the plate, in the team's final inning.

MAKING 'EM COUNT: In their six wins over the Rumble Ponies this season, the Thunder have averaged 10 runs per game. Major contributors include Mandy Alvarez, who leads Trenton with 10 RBI against Binghamton, while Devyn Bolasky and Gosuke Katoh lead active Thunder players with 11 hits each in the season series.

KEEP IT CLEAN: Over their last 10 games, the Thunder have committed just two errors. The team's 68 total errors are fourth-fewest in the league, and Trenton's .980 fielding percentage is tied for third-best, just two points lower than Altoona's league-leading .982 mark.

NO STREAKS: The Thunder have not won more than two games in a row since May 25-29, when they swept a four-game series in Erie and beat Reading in a series opener at home to win five straight. The team's longest winning streak of the season is six games (May 2-8).

ROUGH ROAD: The Thunder are just two games above .500 (23-21) on the road this season (compared to seven over .500 at home) and have not won a road series since taking three of four in Bowie June 12-14. Trenton also owns a team ERA more than one run higher on the road (3.90) than at home (2.88).
