TODAY'S GAME: Finale of a four-game series against the Lakeland Flying Tigers (DET) at Publix Field at Joker Marchant Stadium (1-2), and final contest of a seven-game road trip against the Daytona Tortugas and Flying Tigers (2-5)...Florida dropped the three-game series at Osceola County Stadium, April 20-22, falling in two of the three contests...The Fire Frogs went 4-5 against the Flying Tigers in 2017, including 1-3 on the road.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: 20-year-old Joey Wentz starts the the finale of the four-game series against the Lakeland Flying Tigers on Sunday afternoon...The 6'5" lefty entered the 2018 season as the 10th-ranked prospect in the Atlanta Braves organization, according to MLB.com...The 2016 suffered his first loss since May 8, 2017 (23 starts), when he allowed three runs on five hits, three walks and three strikeouts against the Daytona Tortugas on April 24...The Kansas native worked 4.1 innings, tossing a season-high 87 pitches in the start...Sunday will be Wentz's first career start against the Flying Tigers.

EARLY LEAD SLIPS AWAY IN 5-2 LOSS TO LAKELAND: The Florida Fire Frogs took an early 1-0 advantage over the Lakeland Flying Tigers on Saturday night, but the visitors had the lead slip away into a 5-2 defeat at Publix Field at Joker Marchant Stadium.

Anfernee Seymour's ground-rule double in the third plated Shean Michel to give the visitors a 1-0 lead, but Lakeland pushed across five runs in the fourth on four hits, a walk and a hit batter to take the advantage away.

Jon Kennedy made his return to the Florida Fire Frogs with 2.1 scoreless frames, and Sean McLaughlin held the Flying Tigers off the board in the eighth and ninth innings to end the night for the bullpen.

WELCOME BACK: Jon Kennedy made his return to the mound at the High-A level with 2.1 scoreless innings on Saturday night...The 6-foot-9 lefty gave up two hits, but also struck out six batters to set a new season-high for the Fire Frogs out of the bullpen...The native of Melbourne, Australia has tossed eight-consecutive scoreless frames, dating back to April 17...The southpaw also leads all Fire Frogs pitchers with 20 strikeouts.

MICHEL'S DEBUT: Shean Michel made his team debut on Saturday night, and scored the first run of the game for the Fire Frogs...The 20-year-old outfielder also had an outfield assist in the third inning, throwing out Daz Cameron on second base after his one-out single.

2017: Spent the full season with Single-A Rome and went 8-3 with a 2.60 ERA (38 ER/131.2 IP) and 152 strikeouts...Ranked in the Top 10 among Braves farmhands (min. 75.0 IP) in starter's ERA (T2nd, 2.60), wins (T3rd, 8), strikeouts (3rd, 152), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (3rd, 10.4), innings pitched (7th, 131.1) and hits per 9.0 innings (T8th, 6.8)...Named by the South Atlantic League as a Post-Season All-Star and as the league's Most Outstanding Pitcher...Ranked second in the SAL in strikeouts and fourth in ERA...Ended the season on a seven-game winning streak, going 7-0 with a 2.35 ERA over his final 17 starts...Entered the season tabbed by MLB.com as Atlanta's No. 8 prospect, and by Baseball America as the Braves' No. 15 farmhand.

2016: Selected by the Braves with the 40th overall selection in the 2016 First-Year Player Draft and split his first professional season between the GCL Braves and rookie-level Danville, going 1-4 with a 3.68 ERA (18 ER/44.0 IP) over 12 starts...Opened his career with four scoreless outings for the GCL Braves before advancing to Danville on 7/20...Baseball America tabbed him as the 10th-best prospect in the Appalachian League at the season's end...Entered the 2016 draft ranked as Baseball America's 26th-best prospect and the 16th-best player in the draft class according to MLB.com...Led Shawnee Mission East High to the 2016 Kansas Class 6A state championship and was named the Sunflower League Player of the Year after going a perfect 9-0 while not allowing an earned run in 51.1 innings pitched...Struck out 104 batters over 51.1 high-school innings and allowed just seven hits with 12 walks

2017: Acquired by Atlanta in January and played the full season with Single-A Rome...His 92 strikeouts led all Atlanta relief farmhands, and his 12.4 SO/9.0 IP was the second-best rate in the system (min. 60.0 IP)...Also ranked in the Top 10 among Atlanta's relief prospects (min. 30.0 IP) in hits per 9.0 innings (6th, 6.5), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6th, 3.68) and ERA (7th, 2.16)...Opponents batted just .198 (48-for-243) against him.
2016: Made his professional debut with Low-A Everett after being selected by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft...Struck out 13.5 batters per 9.0 innings, the second-highest rate in the Mariners system (min. 20.0 IP)...Held left-handed batters to a .111 (3-for-27) average and zero extra-base hits, while righties batted .290 (20-for-69)...Finished his career at Alabama as the school's career leader with 30 saves after pitching three seasons for the Crimson Tide.

2017: Began the season on the major league disabled list before spending the remainder of the season in the minor leagues with Double-A Mississippi and Triple-A Gwinnett...Went 3-2 with a 6.20 ERA (31 ER/45.0 IP) in 41 combined games out of the bullpen...Walked 46 while striking out 39. Placed on the 10-day disabled list on 3/30 with a right elbow strain and after making a rehabilitation assignment to Single-A Florida and Triple-A Gwinnett, was optioned to the G-Braves the day he was activated, 5/7. Optioned to the M-Braves on 8/2, where he finished the season...Issued at least one walk in 12 of his 14 games with Mississippi.
2016: Split the season between Atlanta and Double-A Mississippi, making his major league debut on 6/27 with a scoreless inning of relief vs. CLE. Started the year with the M-Braves before the Braves recalled him on 6/27...Remained with the Braves for the remainder of the season, finishing with six saves and five wins to become the eighth Braves rookie in Atlanta franchise history to have at least five wins and five saves in a season...Mike Stanton did it last in 1991, winning five times and saving seven games. His six saves were fourth most among MLB rookies...From the date of his debut (6/27) through the end of the season, his 41 games pitched tied for the most appearances by a rookie pitcher in the majors...Among all pitchers in that time frame, Cabrera tied for the seventh most appearances in the majors, five off the lead of ARI's Randall Delgado and SD's Brad Hand. Did not allow a home run over his 38.1 innings. Finished with the second-highest average pitch velocity in the majors at 100.6...Only Aroldis Chapman (100.9) threw harder, according to MLB's Statcast...He and Chapman were the only two pitchers to throw a pitch at least 103 mph. Earned his first career win, 7/19 at CIN. Collected his first save, 6/30 vs. MIA. Compiled a 1.25 ERA (3 ER/21.2 IP) over 21 games, 6/23-9/7.
