TRIBE TIPS

HOLY TOLEDO: The Indians meet the Mud Hens this evening for the opener of a brief two-game series at Fifth Third Field. This is the first of 25 meetings between the two IL West rivals. Indy has had Toledo's number over the years; the Tribe won the season series last year 14-10 -- going 7-3 in Toledo -- and lead the all-time series dating back to 1988 by a wide margin, 232-191 (.548).

CALL IT A COMEBACK: The Indians totaled 26 comeback wins in 2018 and earned their first of the 2019 season on Sunday, thanks to a four-run ninth inning, their largest output for runs in a single inning so far this season. The win also staved off what would've been an 0-4 start; Indy's only 0-4 start to the season as Pittsburgh's Triple-A affiliate since 2005 came in 2011.

KE'BRYAN THE KEY: Tribe third baseman Ke'Bryan Hayes collected a pair of doubles on Sunday, his first two extra-base hits at the Triple-A level. His second two-bagger split the right-center gap during Indy's four-run ninth, scoring a pair of runs, also giving him his first two RBI in an Indians uniform.

JAKE THE SNAKE: Jake Elmore finished second in the IL in on-base percentage (.397) and tied for eighth in batting average (.289) in 2018. He's off to another strong start this year, collecting three consecutive two-hit games from the No. 9 spot in the order. He has accounted for half of Indy's multi-hit performances in 2019.

EIGHT HITS AGAIN, AND AGAIN, AND AGAIN: Indianapolis has totaled exactly eight hits in each of its first four games this season and 10 of its last 12 games dating back to Aug. 27, 2018. Indy didn't total exactly eight base hits in a game until their 14th game of the season last year. The Tribe had a total of 23 games with exactly eight hits in 2018, and they went 17-6 when doing so.

HE'S NO ROOKIE: Right-hander Rookie Davis, 25, will be making his Pirates organizational debut this evening in the series opener at Toledo. After missing most of the 2018 season recovering from offseason hip surgery and making just nine rehab appearances with the AZL Reds, High-A Daytona and Double-A Pensacola, Davis is back at the Triple-A level for the third time in his eight-year career. He pitched for Louisville in both 2016 and 2017, compiling a 4-6 record, 5.55 ERA (52er/84.1ip) and 69 strikeouts against just 20 walks in 16 games (15 starts).

VERA GOOD DEBUT: Right-hander Eduardo Vera, 24, made his Triple-A debut on Sunday in Columbus and threw 6.0 shutout innings with six punchouts in a no-decision. After undergoing Tommy John surgery in 2015, Vera eased his way back into a starting role. Since the beginning of the 2016 campaign, he is 19-13 with a 3.31 ERA (111er/302.0ip) in 61 games (46 starts). He owns a 4.34 strikeout-to-walk ratio (217 K/50 BB) over the last three-plus seasons. He posted an 11-5 record and 3.37 ERA (58er/155.0ip) between High-A Bradenton (9 starts) and Double-A Altoona (17 starts) last year, finishing second among Pirates minor leaguers in innings pitched, third in ERA and tied for fifth in wins. He also earned his first career All-Star nomination last year, doing so in the Florida State League with the Marauders.

RISP-Y BUSINESS: Through four games the Indians offense has totaled just six hits (four singles, two doubles) in 45 at-bats with runners in scoring position (.133). That .133 average is good for 13th in the IL, ahead of only Rochester (.050, 1-for-20). Three of Indy's six knocks with RISP came in Sunday's contest, however, leading to a 5-2 victory.

PROSPECTS GALORE: Indy's roster features eight of Pittsburgh's top-30 prospects, according to both *Baseball America* and MLB.com. Pitchers Mitch Keller (No. 1 BA/No. 1 MLB.com), Clay Holmes (No. 17 BA/No. 23 MLB.com) and JT Brubaker (No. 27 BA/No. 21 MLB.com) are joined by five position players with top-prospect status: 3B Ke'Bryan Hayes (No. 2 BA/No. 2 MLB.com), 2B Kevin Kramer (No. 5 BA/No. 6 MLB.com), SS Cole Tucker (No. 6 BA/No. 5 MLB.com), OF Bryan Reynolds (No. 9 BA/No. 8 MLB.com) and 1B Will Craig (No. 16 BA/No. 15 MLB.com).

Tonight's Starter: Right-hander Rookie Davis will make his Tribe debut in the first game of the series at Toledo. The 25-year-old from Sneads Ferry, N.C. was injured for most of the 2018 season and only made rehab appearances with the AZL Reds, Single A-Advanced Daytona and Double-A Pensacola. In those rehab outings, he went 2-2 with a 6.49 ERA (19er/26.1ip) and 24 strikeouts. The 6-foot-5, 255-pound starter was originally drafted by New York (AL) in the 14th round (449th overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft and was acquired by Pittsburgh on Feb. 18, 2019 as a minor league free agent.

This Spring: Davis went 0-1 with a 7.50 ERA (5er/6.0ip) and one save in three appearances (two starts). He allowed seven hits and walked five with six punchouts.

Against the Mud Hens: Davis is 1-2 in three career starts against Toledo with a 3.44 ERA (7er/18.1ip). His last start against the Mud Hens came on Aug. 25, 2017 at Fifth Third Field, where he tied a career high for innings pitched in an 8.0-inning start and allowed only four hits and one run (unearned).

Miscellaneous: His full name is William Theron Davis III and he was given the nickname Rookie by his dad at birth; his dad knew it would be his only son and hoped he would play baseball. ... Traded from New York (AL) to Cincinnati on Dec. 28, 2015 with RHP Caleb Cotham, INF Eric Jagielo and 2B Tony Renda in exchange for LHP Aroldis Chapman.
